Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments Student-Level Reports Available

The Winter 2022 Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments testing window is open now until **February 4, 2022**. Student Level Reports for the Winter 2022 administration are available in the Dynamic Reporting System through the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site. Reports are available within 48 hours of students completing all portions of a content area test.

Available reports include:

- Individual Student Report (ISR) separated by content area, provides detailed information on individual student achievement and scale score
- Student Roster Report allows users to view student Overall Scale Score, Standard Error, Points Earned by assessment category, and domain subtotal by grade, content, domains, and categories
- Student Trend Report displays up to three years of historical Early Literacy and Benchmark Assessment score data
- Domain Analysis Report displays the Overall Content Scale Score and the number of Points Earned in each domain for each student

MI-Access Grade Level and Alignment Changes for Science

The MI-Access science assessment is changing in 2022. These changes in MI-Access science grade level and content alignments have been under consideration in past years and become a reality for Spring 2022.

Starting this spring, MI-Access Functional Independence, Supported Independence, and Participation science assessments will be given in grades 5, 8, and 11 (formerly given in grades 4, 7, and 11).

This change aligns the grade levels at which both Michigan's general assessment (M-STEP) and the alternate assessment (MI-Access) are given.

All MI-Access science assessments are aligned to the alternate content expectations (essential elements) that were finalized in the spring of 2020. Each assessment measures the corresponding essential elements' level of complexity (range):

- MI Access Functional Independence = High Range
- MI Access Supported Independence = Medium Range
- MI-Access Participation = Low Range

MI-Access science is no longer aligned to the 2007 extended benchmarks.

At the main MI-Access page, click the red "Michigan's alternate content expectations" link (top of the page). Then click on the "science and social studies" link and follow the individual grade level alternate content expectations links.

Note: Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams should consider making amendments to IEPs to reflect these changes for 2022.

OPEN NOW: M-STEP Passage-based Writing Field Test Administration Window

The online M-STEP Passage-based Writing Field Test administration window is open until February 4, 2022. Through your optional participation, the Michigan Department of Education is able to gather important information about the accuracy and validity of items on the field test.

The Passage-based Writing Field Test Administration Guide is now available on the M-STEP web page (www.michigan.gov/mstep). This guide includes information about important dates and other information about the field test for Assessment Coordinators, Test Administrators, and Technology Coordinators, as well as test administration directions to be used during the administration.

Alternate INSIGHT Availability Request Window: January 6 - March 18, 2022

In order to have access to M-STEP or MI-Access FI testing software after 4:00 p.m. on testing days, schools must submit an <u>Alternate INSIGHT Availability</u> Request (https://forms.office.com/g/5e0tfVWDi7).

Note: This access request is only for schools that hold regular instructional hours extending beyond 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Requests must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. on March 18, 2022.

Pre-ID and Material Orders – SAT, PSAT, WorkKeys, M-STEP, and MI-Access

At this time, districts and schools are to be working on their Pre-ID Student report in the <u>OEAA Secure Site</u> (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) for the Spring 2022 SAT, PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, WorkKeys, M-STEP, and MI-Access administrations.

Schools/districts will receive their paper/pencil assessment materials and printed barcode labels based on the students who they pre-identify in the Secure Site by 5:00 p.m., February 16, 2022.

WHAT'S NEW

Pre-ID in the OEAA Secure Site

All students taking the SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 must be pre-identified in the Office of Educational Assessment and Accountability (OEAA) Secure Site by 5:00 p.m. on February 16, 2022. Review the November 18, 2021 Spotlight edition for information from the Michigan Department of Education about the Pre-ID process.

Determining Test Material Orders

- The Pre-ID process creates the initial order for pre-printed ID labels for each student identified by this deadline, and determines the quantity of standard test materials to be shipped to schools.
- Accommodated test materials are shipped based on accommodations for students in the pending and approved status in SSD Online by February 22, 2022.

Accommodations and Support Webinar Posted

State-Allowed Accommodations and English Learner Supports Window

- Beginning in the week of January 10, 2022, Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinators can submit requests for stateallowed accommodations (SAAs) and English learner time and one-half (+50% extended time) support in SSD Online.
- As of now, if your school administered Fall 2021
 College Board assessments, you may be able
 see the option of submitting requests for English
 learner extended time in SSD Online. If the
 option is not currently available, check again in
 the week of January 10, 2022.
- If you already requested extended time for your English learners for the Fall 2021 testing, you do not need to re-enter those requests for Spring 2022 testing; the request is good for the academic year.
- SAAs are good for one academic year only. If a student used an SAA for Spring 2021 testing, the SSD Coordinator must either request the SAA again or request a College Board-approved accommodation for Spring 2022 testing.



SSD Online Issue

- There is a known issue in SSD Online, causing SSD Coordinators to receive a message about "Error Adding Student" when attempting to add a new student in SSD Online. This error will not occur with all students nor with all requests.
- If you receive this error message, use the Transfer/Move Request Form in SSD Online to add that student to your school's dashboard.
- SSD Coordinators will need the student's SSD number to submit the form. To locate their SSD number, students can log into their College Board account, select "Update Your Account", then scroll to the bottom of the page and follow the directions there.
- If the transfer takes longer than seven days to complete, or if further assistance is needed, contact the Michigan Educator Hotline and choose the option for SSD.
- If you have more than 10 students to transfer, send an email to ssd@info.collgeboard.org and request a bulk transfer template. It is expected that transfers will occur in 3-5 days.

Pre-identify Students and Order WorkKeys Test Materials

The window to submit student data for pre-ID barcode labels and to order ACT WorkKeys standard-time and accommodations materials through the OEAA Secure Site (www.michigan.gov/oeaa-secure) is January 5 – February 16, 2022 (up to 5:00 p.m.).

Instructions for these activities can be found on the <u>Secure Site Training web page</u> (www.michigan. gov/securesitetraining) under the Pre-Identification of Students and the Material Ordering sections.

Initial material orders for Standard Time, Regular Print WorkKeys materials will be based on the number of students pre-identified on the OEAA Secure Site by 5:00 p.m. on February 16, 2022. Accommodated materials and Spanish test booklets (if needed) must be ordered through the OEAA Secure Site on the Initial Material Orders page by 5:00 p.m. on February 16, 2022.

The projected number of Standard Time, Regular Print materials that will be sent, based on the pre-identification, can be viewed on the Initial Material Orders page on the OEAA Secure Site. The number of Standard Time, Regular Print materials can only be adjusted by pre-identifying additional students and unassigning students from the testing. Accommodated and Spanish materials orders will automatically reduce the number of Standard Time booklets.

Student Preparation – Go for Platinum!

Encourage students to understand the types of questions they will see in ACT WorkKeys, since it is different than other types of exams. Students and teachers can access **free** <u>practice</u> <u>questions</u> from all three tests, ranging from easier content to the most difficult. Teachers may use these practice questions as Questions of the Day or as warm-up activities in the weeks leading up to test day.

Students can also create a user account and take free full-length online practice tests (https://testregistration.org/rsp/Login. do?event=go&realm=20770563). Students can pace themselves in real-time test scenarios and receive scores indicating how they might perform on the WorkKeys assessments.
