

## GENERAL ORGANIZATION OF THE ASSESSMENT

The Michigan Interim Assessment Spring 2014 Pilot consists of **two parts** that are recommended to be scheduled as separate assessment sessions. The Interim Assessment Building Coordinator must discuss the schedule with the Assessment Administrator at least two weeks prior to the administration dates. If a student is not present when Part 1 is administered to the class, the student should take Part 2 at the same time as the rest of the class and take Part 1 at a later scheduled time. However, the two parts of the test should be administered to the students in order, if possible. Enough time should be scheduled in a testing session for the preparation of the computers and testing space. Approximately 10–15 minutes should be allowed for additional administration tasks, such as arranging seating, starting up computers, distributing Test Tickets, passing out scrap paper, etc. The Michigan Interim Assessment Spring 2014 Pilot is an untimed assessment. Testing times provided below are approximate and are supplied for scheduling purposes only.
