The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) in Michigan

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) is a federal program that helps supplement the diets of low-income persons, by providing them with emergency food and nutrition assistance at no cost. TEFAP is administered locally by 28 agencies and 7 food banks, covering all Michigan counties. It is estimated that more than one million people in Michigan receive TEFAP food each year.
