SUBJECT: Teacher Certification Requirement for Membership Purposes 2021-22

The state legislature passed and the governor signed into law Public Act 48 of 2021, which defines teacher certification requirements for membership purposes in section 6 (MCL 388.1606) of the state school aid act.

MCL 388.1606(8)

"... A pupil not counted as 1.0 full-time equated membership due to an absence from a class is counted as a prorated membership for the classes the pupil attended. For purposes of this subsection, "class" means either of the following, as applicable:

- A period of time in one day when pupils and an individual who is (a) appropriately placed under a valid certificate, substitute permit, authorization or approval issued by the department are together and instruction is taking place. This subdivision does not apply for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years.
- For the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years only, a period of time (b) in one day when pupils and a certificated teacher, a teacher engaged to teach under section 1233b of the revised school code, MCL 380.1233b, or an individual working under a valid substitute permit, authorization or approval issued by the department are together and instruction is taking place."

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As such, for the 2021-22 school year, pupil membership auditors will only review teacher placements for grade level placement as described in subsection (b) above.

However, pursuant to the state legislature's change in law (MCL 388.1763), districts must ensure that teachers are appropriately placed for the grade level and subject area (either with certificate or permit) to avoid a salary deduction. If an educator is not able to be placed appropriately (grade level and subject area), the district must obtain a permit for the placement of the teacher outside of his or her endorsement to avoid a salary deduction.

The above requirements pertain to virtual teachers, as well, as noted in MDE MEMO #095-21.

Districts must take note that subsection (a) will require a teacher to be appropriately placed for both the grade level and subject area for membership purposes and to avoid salary deductions for the 2022-23 school year. Auditor training for the 2022-23 school year will be provided.
