

QUESTION FROM A MEMBER

When treating LTBI with 3HP...

- How often does your patient see the provider? Not including their regularly scheduled DOT nurse visits (if you're doing DOT).
 - Do you schedule monthly appointments?
- If your patient goes off 3HP, are they given "credit" for what they've already taken?
 - Example: If a person completes 4 weeks of 3HP and then changes to RIF, do they only need 3 months of Rifampin or do they start over?
- Do most HDs only prescribe 3HP if there is insurance?
- Do you give your first dose at the clinic?
 - If so, is the med supplied at the clinic?
