Initiative Announcements

Welcome

Welcome to the 2017 Patient Centered Medical Home Initiative, and the second release of our monthly newsletter. Michigan Data Collaborative Announcements

Michigan Data Collaborative (MDC) is the data analysis and visualization partner for the PCMH Initiative. As the Initiative moves forward, we want to make sure you are aware of the following key information:

PCMH Patient Lists

MDC has posted a preliminary January list and the February Medicaid Patient Lists. The PCMH Patient List provided a current list of patients based on the PCP on record with the Medicaid Health Plan participating in SIM. In the second week of March, the revised January list will be available. As a reminder, the preliminary January list did not include any provider or practice changes that were submitted in the last few weeks of January, and should not be used for purposes of calculating payments. The changes submitted in January are reflected in your February Patient List and in this revised January Patient List.

User Access

Feedback from participants has helped us to develop the following list of useful hints to ensure a successful setup and sign-on process:

- Michigan Data Collaborative uses two-factor authentication. You must complete the instructions in the
 Installing Duo and Using Two-Factor Authentication guide in order to access your SIM Patient List.

 MDC recommends using the mobile device option for a more seamless setup and authentication
 process
- The preferred option for an internet browser is Mozilla FireFox.
- If your name has not been submitted to MDC by your managing organization's acknowledger, then you are not authorized to access the PCMH data.
- If you are having difficulty accessing our SIM PCMH Project Site to download files, MDC now has the option to use an alternate method of secure file delivery. Please contact us using the email address to the left, if you would like to use this option.

Self-Management Training for Care Managers and Care Coordinators

The PCMH Initiative is happy to announce a partnership with the Michigan Center for Clinical Systems Improvement (MiCCSI) to offer Self-Management Support Training. The Self-Management Support training is an initial learning requirement for all Care Managers and Care Coordinators within the PCMH Initiative. Through this partnership, Care Managers and Coordinators embedded within Participating organizations and serving patients attributed to the PCMH Initiative can enroll in this required learning activity at no charge to the organization/practice. Note that the Initiative does not require that Care Managers and Coordinators complete their Self-Management Support Training Requirement through the MiCCSI course. Your organization may choose to fulfil this initial learning requirement through one of the other MiCMRC Approved Self-Management Training Programs, however only the MiCCSI program costs will be subsidized by the Initiative.

SIM PCMH Quick Billing and Coding Survey – Complete by March 8, 2017

To facilitate and provide SIM PCMH Initiative practices with support and resources for billing care management services for eligible members, a national billing and coding expert, in partnership with the Initiative, will facilitate a series of webinars and office hours. In preparation, and to provide additional insight into participant interests and needs, a short survey has been prepared and is available at: Billing and Coding Quick Survey.

Each SIM PCMH practice or PO should complete the survey by Wednesday March 8, 2017. It is a short survey and will take less than fifteen minutes for most organizations to complete. Please involve your biller/coder (if you have access to one), PO or practice manager, lead care manager, and others in your organization in the completion of the survey.

Ensuring Accurate PO, Practice and Provider Information Reminder

The PCMH Initiative actively monitors physician organization (PO), practice and provider information (TINs, NPIs, addresses, etc.) in partnership with Medicaid Health Plans (MHPs) for attribution, identification and payment purposes. As a reminder, any changes to this type of information must be submitted to the PCMH Initiative within 7 days of the change. To further ensure accuracy of the information, lead participating organization contacts will receive a quarterly spreadsheet of current information that should be reviewed for accuracy. While all of the data should be reviewed, there are a few key elements that are especially important:

- An accurate list of providers. The Initiative will process patient population attribution monthly, so any
 provider change need to be reported as soon as possible to ensure patient attribution is correct.
- PO and Practice TIN and payment address. This information is used for identification and payment by the MHPs.

A reminder that participants must give a 60-day notice to terminate participation from the Initiative. The practice must continue to serve patients during that 60-day period. In order to make changes or note plans for participation termination, complete the change form, or highlight the information on the quarterly spreadsheet you receive and send it to SIMPCMH@mail.mihealth.org

MiCMRC Updates New eLearning "Basic Care Management Program"

As shared in our <u>January Newsletter</u>, The Michigan Care Management Resource announced an interactive online program, focused on building care management skills and quick tools for daily work. The online eLearning series is open to all care managers and physician office practice team members at no cost, providing an opportunity to learn at your pace, at a time convenient for you!

The Basic Care Management Program consists of a series of online, interactive modules. Each module has brief 15-30 minute lessons; ideal for the busy learner.
