SIM PCMH Initiative Staff Updates:

As the SIM PCMH Initiative wraps up its 2017 activities and prepares for the 2018 calendar year, we are excited to announce three new staff members that will be instrumental in our continued success. First we would like to introduce Lyndsay Tyler who will be joining the team as a business analyst. Lyndsay is employed by Michigan Public Health Institute (MPHI) and has been working with SIM project for the past 2 years as part of the evaluation team. She is transitioning to the Care Delivery team and will be integral in supporting all of the SIM PCMH Initiative activities. Over the past month, the initiative has gained support from Lydia Lantis, joining us from the MDHHS Medical Services Administration Actuarial Division. Lydia will provide support to the Initiative by managing the payment process communication to participating practices and POs, and participating payers. The Initiative is also very excited to announce our newest hire, Laura Kilfoyle. Laura will serve as the PCMH Initiative Coordinator and brings a wealth of knowledge and experiences to the team. She most recently worked as the MI-CHAP Director for the Michigan Association of United Ways and will begin work on the SIM PCMH Initiative on October 30th.

Quarter 3 payment update:

As discussed during the [Quarter 3 Virtual Update Meeting](#), participating payers will be processing the Quarter 3 PMPMs for Practice Transformation and Care Coordination, in addition to reconciliations for Quarter 1 payments. Each participant key contact will receive a message with the summary of the payments they should expect to receive a message with the summary of the payments they should expect to receive by participating payer. Additionally, the Michigan Data Collaborative has made a Q1 Difference Report available on the SIM PCMH Initiative Portal with detailed information about the reconciliations taking place. Plans are expected to make payments by November 20th, 2017.

Practice Transformation Collaborative: Phase 2 Update:

Thank you to all practice teams that submitted interest in participating in Phase 2 of the Practice Transformation Collaborative! We are excited to see the investment and drive your teams have in ensuring success in the continued development of your Clinical Community Linkages. A formal application for the Practice Transformation Collaborative: Phase 2 will be released via email on November 13th, additionally we will cohost an informational webinar with our partners at Institute for Healthcare Improvement on November 17th to support those interested in completing the application process. If your practice team did not submit your interest (via your Semi-Annual Practice Transformation Report submission) in participating, you will still be eligible to submit an application for participation.

PCMH Care Coordination Reports:

The first quarterly PCMH Care Coordination reports were recently released and a [Quick Reference Guide](#) is now available. MDC will be sending a survey soon to gather your input on any additional care management/care coordination reporting you may need.

Upcoming MDC Deliverables:

HEDIS Benchmarks on Dashboard:

The HEDIS benchmarks have been temporarily removed from the Dashboard while MDC explores options to display them for the expanding set of measures. Measures on the SIM PCMH Dashboard will be transitioned

to [HEDIS 2018](#) for Dashboard Release 3.0, which is currently targeted for the end of January 2018. We will provide more information about this change in the coming months.

Easy e-Asthma Action Plans:

You know it's important for your patients with asthma to have an action plan – it's how they know what to do to stay in control, and what to do when asthma symptoms start. Does your practice struggle to find one plan all of the clinicians will like and use? [Check out the Asthma Initiative of Michigan's new e-AAPs!](#)

Three National Heart Lung and Blood Institution guidelines-based versions are available: adult, student (5 to 18 years old), and age 0-4 years old. These easy-to-use fillable PDF plans can be customized to your clinic and added to EHRs. Each plan features age-appropriate medications and doses in drop down menus for asthma, GERD and allergy medications, and includes a trigger section. The 0-4 year old version includes a place for parental permission to administer meds at school or daycare. The student version includes places for permission to self-carry and administer inhalers at school, and to share the AAP with others who need it.
