HFA believes early, nurturing relationships are the foundation for healthy development. Home visitors walk alongside caregivers on their parenting journeys and provide support, encouragement, guidance and education. The enrollment timeframe is pregnancy to 24 months and home visitors can support families for 3 to 5 years. The visit frequency ranges from weekly to monthly depending on family progress.

MIHP offers home visits from caring and trustworthy social workers and nurses who work in partnership with families to ensure they feel supported through pregnancy and parenthood. Enrollment: Medicaid-eligible pregnant persons and infants through 12 months of age may enroll. Services continue throughout pregnancy and up to 18 months of age based on the needs of the infant and their caregiver. Visits are offered monthly but may be more frequent.
