What is NHBS?


- The National HIV Behavioral Surveillance System (NHBS) is a survey funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to monitor behaviors of populations at high risk for HIV infection.
- Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) participated in the injection drug use (IDU) cycle in 2006, 2009, 2012, and 2015.
- Information collected from NHBS IDU cycles can be used to describe trends among PWID in Wayne and Oakland County.
- In 2018, MDHHS will again participate in the NHBS IDU cycle, this time including Macomb County residents.

Drug at First Injection




Syringe Safety Practices (in the past year)


Hooked on Painkillers

Injection Drug Use and Health

- The 2015 survey cycle of PWID consisted of 591 participants who had used injection drugs in the past 12 months and met the residency requirements. Some key findings:
- 19 percent of people reported always disposing of used syringes safely
- 87 percent of respondents recall ever being tested for HIV. 40 percent tested in the past year
- 1.3 percent of participants had ever tested positive for HIV
- 79 percent of respondents reported ever testing for Hepatitis C. Of those, half reported testing positive
- 45 percent of respondents had overdosed in the past
- The median age at first injection among respondents was 22 years old.
