NATIONAL HIV BEHAVIORAL SURVEILLANCE (NHBS) FACT SHEET FROM INTERVIEWS AMONG WOMEN AT HIGH RISK OF HIV INFECTION IN WAYNE AND OAKLAND COUNTIES, MI, 2016

What is NHBS?

The National HIV Behavioral Surveillance System (NHBS) is a survey funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to monitor behaviors of populations at high risk for HIV infection.

Heterosexuals at increased risk for HIV (HET) are those who live in high poverty areas across Wayne or Oakland Counties.

Michigan Department of Health and Human Services participated in the HET cycle in 2010, 2013, and 2016, and will again participate in 2019.

Information collected from NHBS HET cycles can be used to describe trends in the heterosexual population in Wayne County, identify gaps in prevention services, and help design more effective HIV prevention programs.

Characteristics of Sample

In 2016, a snowball sampling strategy was designed to increase participation among women who exchange sex for money, drugs, or other items. Eligible participants were females living in Wayne or Oakland Counties, MI who had sex with a person of the opposite sex in the 12 months preceding the survey.



BEHAVIORS AMONG HIGH **RISK WOMEN**

Among the 517 women found eligible to participate in the 2016 NHBS Survey, 357 (69%) reported exchange sex in the last 12 months.

Of these, 28% reported the most common way to find exchange partners was walking on the street

22% most commonly found exchange partners through family and friends

19% most commonly picked up exchange partners in public places such as bars and hotels

Women in the sample were asked about a variety of behaviors related to HIV risk:

0.4% had ever tested positive for HIV prior to the survey

0.78% tested positive at the time of the survey

70.6% had engaged in condomless sex in the previous 12 months

63.6% of women engaged in condomless sex with a partner of unknown HIV status

91% of women had never heard of PrEP

6.6% had injected drugs in the past year

35% of women who had injected in the past year had used shared needles
