2019 Counseling, Testing, and Referral (CTR) Module Trainings

All courses are free of charge, but registration is required.

Module 2: HIV Prevention Specialist Training

CTR Module 2: HIV Prevention Specialist Training is a one-day, in-person course. It is designed to provide analysis of possible external and internal socioeconomic, cultural, and social factors a client may experience. Participants will also learn about injection drug use and syringe access programs, as well as additional behavioral assessments and referral options available to clients. Upon completion of the module, participants should be able to facilitate client-centered prevention counseling, understand how external and internal factors can affect a client's behavior, and offer a variety of prevention options based on the client's needs.

Intended Audience: Employees and/or volunteers providing HIV CTR services at State-funded agencies. Others may apply, but seating may not be guaranteed.

Pre-requisites: Successful completion of CTR Module 1 online via MI-TRAIN.

Module 3: HIV Prevention and Test Counselor Certification Training

CTR Module 3: HIV Prevention and Test Counselor Certification Training is a two-day, in-person course. Participants will learn the steps of HIV counseling, testing algorithms and interpreting test results, data collection and reporting, and initiating Partner Services (PS). Interactive role-play activities will allow participants to practice and build skill and confidence. Upon completion of the module, participants should be able to understand and explain the counseling and testing process, collect and report all necessary data, and link clients to PS and other referrals, if needed.

Intended Audience: Employees and/or volunteers providing HIV CTR services at State-funded agencies. Others may apply, but seating may not be guaranteed.

Partner Services (PS) Certification Training

The two-day Partner Services Certification Training for Local Health Departments is designed to familiarize staff with a number of strategies to control and prevent the spread of HIV and other STDs. Utilizing the updated “Recommendations for Conducting Integrated Partners Services for HIV/STD Prevention”, participants will learn about program policy and practices for conducting PS activities. Emphasis will be placed on techniques for working with individuals diagnosed with HIV and other STDs to identify their at-risk partners, so prevention counseling, testing, and referral services can be provided. Participants will learn skills to conduct thorough field investigations and techniques for personal safety. In addition, participants will learn skills to enhance the delivery of partner services.

Intended Audience: This course is required for all HIV Test Counselors who are employed in a local health department and who are designated to conduct PS field investigation activities.

The Impact of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), Compassion Fatigue, and Selfcare Strategies

This update will provide an introduction to trauma and the impact of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), as well as addressing compassion fatigue and selfcare strategies. Participants will receive an overview of NEAR Science (neuroscience, epigenetics, ACEs and resilience) and the impact of toxic stress to physical and mental health. Additionally, this update will explore the concept of compassion fatigue (secondary traumatic stress) and its impact on those who work with traumatized individuals. Specific personal, interpersonal, and organizational strategies for preventing and addressing compassion fatigue will be discussed.

HIV & Reentry Programming for Returning Citizens

This update will examine prevention and care services needs of persons living with HIV within corrections. The United States correctional system is comprised of local and tribal jails, state prisons, federal prisons, military and immigration facilities, and community corrections facilities, which includes probation and parole programs. This training will focus on state prisons. According to the CDC epidemiologic surveys indicated in 2015 the prevalence of HIV was approximately 1.3% among inmates in correctional facilities which markedly higher than the 0.3-0.4% HIV prevalence in the general United States population. This update will provide information and discuss ways in which local health departments and community partners can provide effective services to clients who are returning citizens.
