Theme #1 – Alignment Related to Racial Disparities

In the context of social needs for communities of color, there is a lack of alignment between the myriad of initiatives across the ecosystem. This leads to complexity and confusion and diminishes effectiveness in improving outcomes.

- Workflows and operations
- Data sets and technical systems
- Programs and operations
- Variation between communities

What are ways to increase awareness and improve alignment of SDOH efforts to address racial disparities?

- How could the state or other partners better lead these efforts (e.g. policy, training, etc.)?
- How can the state better leverage decision-making and analytic platforms to better identify and address in racial health disparities?




Theme #2 – Community Approaches & Data Sharing

The approach: A cross-sector, community-wide approach with alignment across SDOH initiatives, re-use of data and technology, and ongoing communication of strategic priorities for addressing social determinants of health and health inequities.

What is needed to support and enhance community approaches for addressing social needs? How would you prioritize these to maximize health outcomes?

- Access to additional data sets
- Aligning SDOH screening tools
- Requiring SDOH data standards to be aligned to national standards (under development) within and across different types of social services (e.g. housing, transportation etc.)
- Use of shared technology platforms
- Additional support to enhance the community efforts? (e.g. policy, training, etc.)



Theme #3 – Health Care, Social Services & Technology

Sharing data across organizations is already challenging. Connecting EHRs to community data systems and data is even harder to achieve.

What support does your organization need to promote increased access to data and integration of available data systems between healthcare providers and community-based social services organizations?

- Understand what data is available
- Development of common data standards between social services providers and healthcare providers
- Assistance in connecting to the systems through APIs
- Funding for implementation, including IT workforce, training and technical assistance, and technology purchase



Theme #4 – Privacy & Consent

Managing consent to ensure patient privacy can be a major barrier to sharing data between healthcare providers and social services organizations. There needs to be focused planning and action to address these concerns in order to foster interoperability.

What specific efforts would support your organization and/or community's ability to address these barriers?

- Education and training
- Consumer access to their personal data
- State-level legal guidance
- Consumer control over consent and revocation of consent (an individual's ability to choose who gets to use or see my data, and when)


