


#### Participating in the Virtual Forum



## Principles for Updating the Statewide Health IT Roadmap

#### Align

- Business strategies
- Priorities

#### Leverage Existing Investments

- Identify and add value to local efforts
- Maximize benefit from existing tools

#### **Shared Goals:**

Data Availability, Useability, Interoperability

#### Validate Input

- Share draft recommendations
- Solicit public comment

#### Inclusivity

- Create spaces for broad feedback
- Conduct comprehensive environmental scan

#### Theme #1 — Technology Adoption and Use

Many providers of aging and disability services have not adopted EHR systems and are limited in their use of information technology.



What have been the major barriers to adoption of technology, especially EHRs?


- Funding, including federal subsidies
- IT workforce
- Implementation challenges
- Commitment of leadership
- Ability to adequately assess different technology vendors

#### Theme #2 — Population Health Management

There are challenges in sharing information during transitions of care, in coordinating services and healthcare across multiple providers, and in managing populations of high-need individuals.

# What would be most helpful to support your work and your clients' needs?

- Medicaid data/analytics from the state on patient populations?
- Connectivity to hospital EHR system
- Medication history
- Care coordination / referral management platform?
- Financial support for adopting technology
- Financial support for connections to MiHIN?
- Digital health tools for home visiting professionals (i.e., electronic assessments on tablets or laptops; connection to an EHR; access to a referral directory)?
- Education and training for using health IT tools?
- Other?



#### Theme #3 — Incorporating Social Services Data

Incorporating social services and SDOH data into provider workflow would help to improve provision of care for elderly and disabled populations. There is limited visibility into this at the present time.

In the context of aging and disabled populations, what would be the most useful social history information you could know about a new patient?







September 2021 Final Draft Roadmap for HITC and MDHHS acceptance/approval

Q2 2021 - Q3 2021

- Draft Roadmap with recommendations for HITC consideration
- Present draft Roadmap to HITC
- Conduct feedback process to validate stakeholder support for Roadmap
- Make necessary revisions

Q3 2020 - Q1 2021

- Engage Stakeholders in Environmental Scan
- Review historical documents
- Synthesize input
- Ensure "directional correctness" with guidance from RSC
- Update HITC




