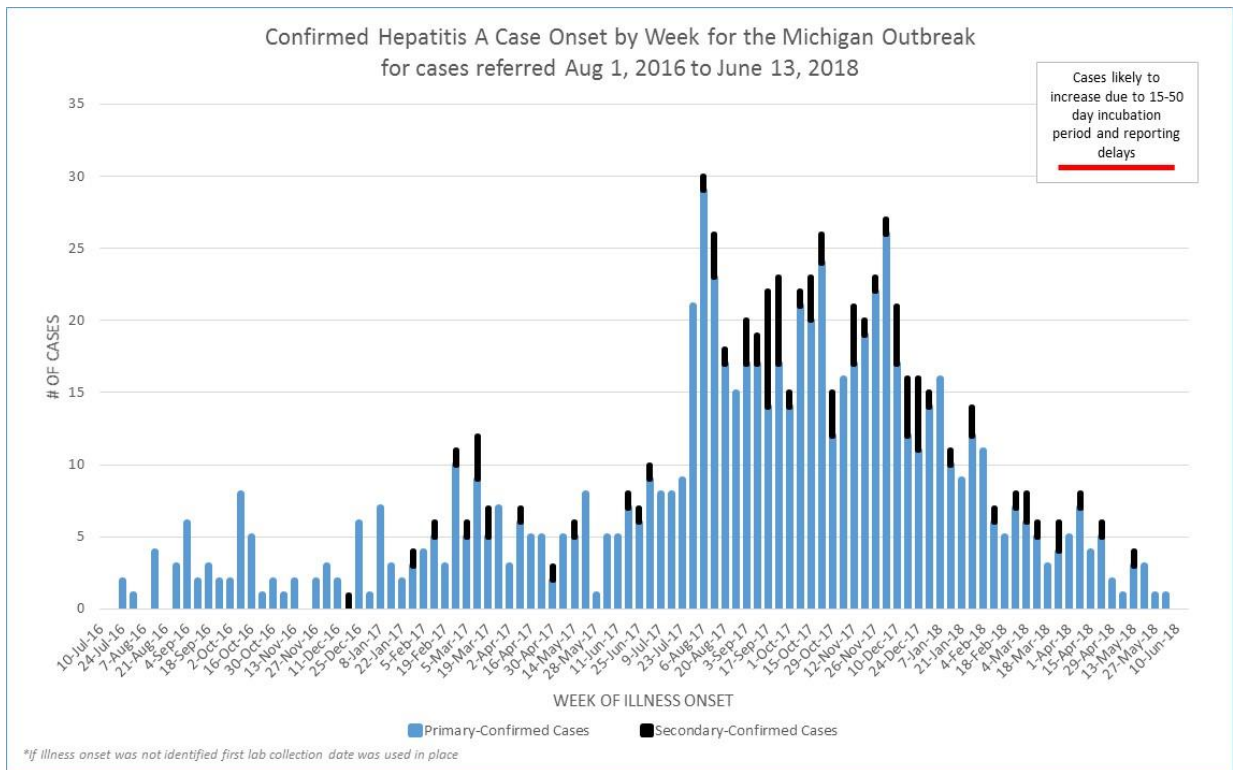

‡ Analysis excludes cases that have been sequenced and found to be PCR Negative, have a different strain from the outbreak strains, or have international travel in the 2-6 weeks prior to illness onset.
