He is experienced in legislative and policy matters, including analysis and testimony, and he aligns effective partnerships at all levels of the law enforcement community to address fraud, waste and abuse vulnerabilities. He also is experienced in using data to direct investigative activities towards high risk vulnerabilities, resulting in effective returns on investment of time and resources.
