Lewis Roubal is chief deputy director for opportunity for the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, where he oversees the department's efforts to provide food and Medicaid assistance to residents in need.

Roubal is a 20-year veteran of MDHHS who has held leadership positions at the department for more than a decade.
