Introduction

- Who am I?

Licensing

- Inspect and license migrant labor farm housing throughout MI
- **5 or more workers**
 - Any number of structures on a *tract of land*, if total is 5 or more workers = regulated
- Process for licensure
 - Annual application (submit 30 days in advance, \$5 fee per 100 square foot)
 - Provide current and compliant water sample report
 - Pass inspection

Location and description of housing

Total number of migrant workers

- Names/Ages
- Length of stay in housing for each person
- Length of agricultural/processing employment
- Contact information

Total number of occupants with names/ages

Contact info for employer and housing provider

Up to \$1000/day fine, maximum \$10,000

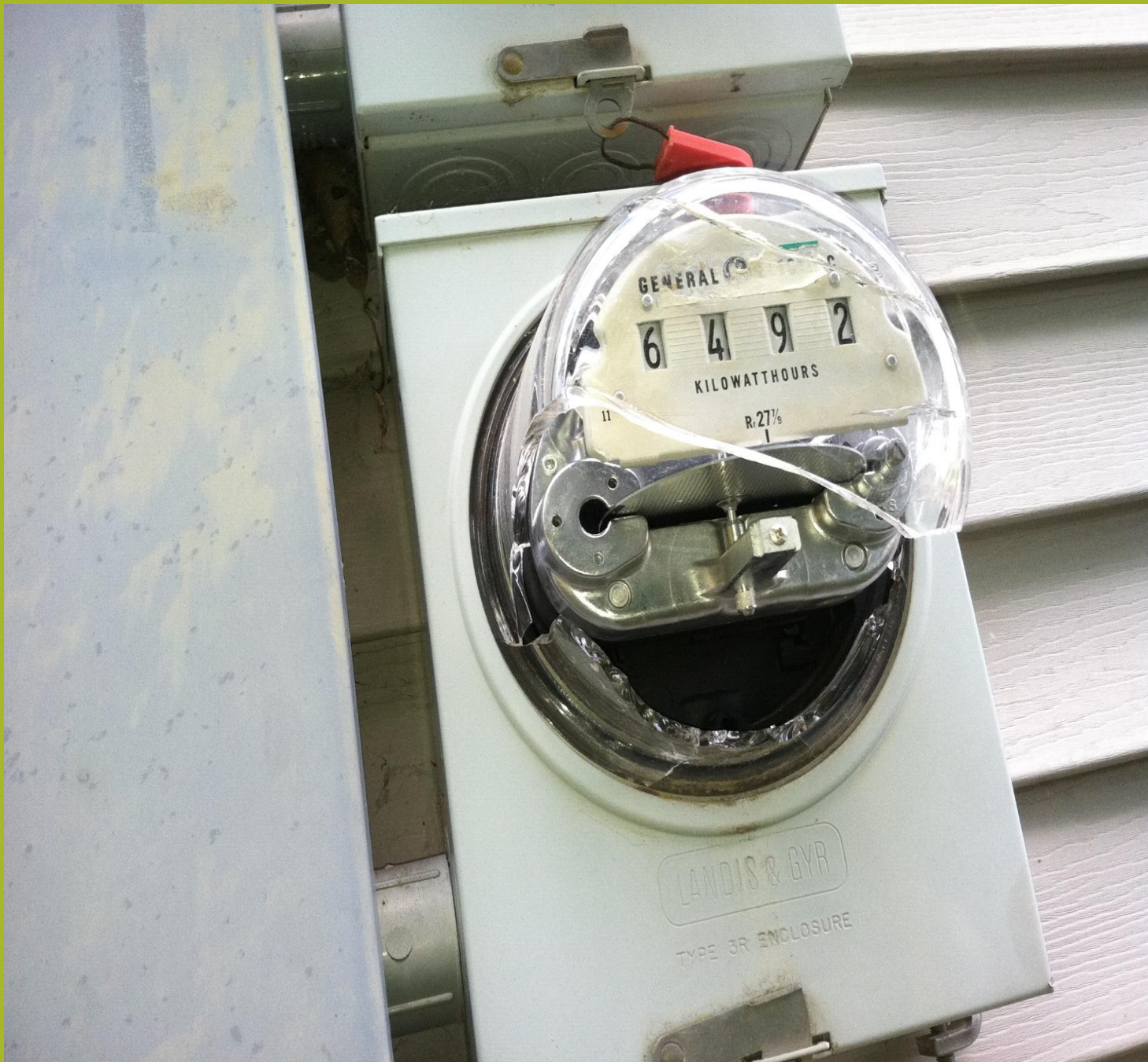




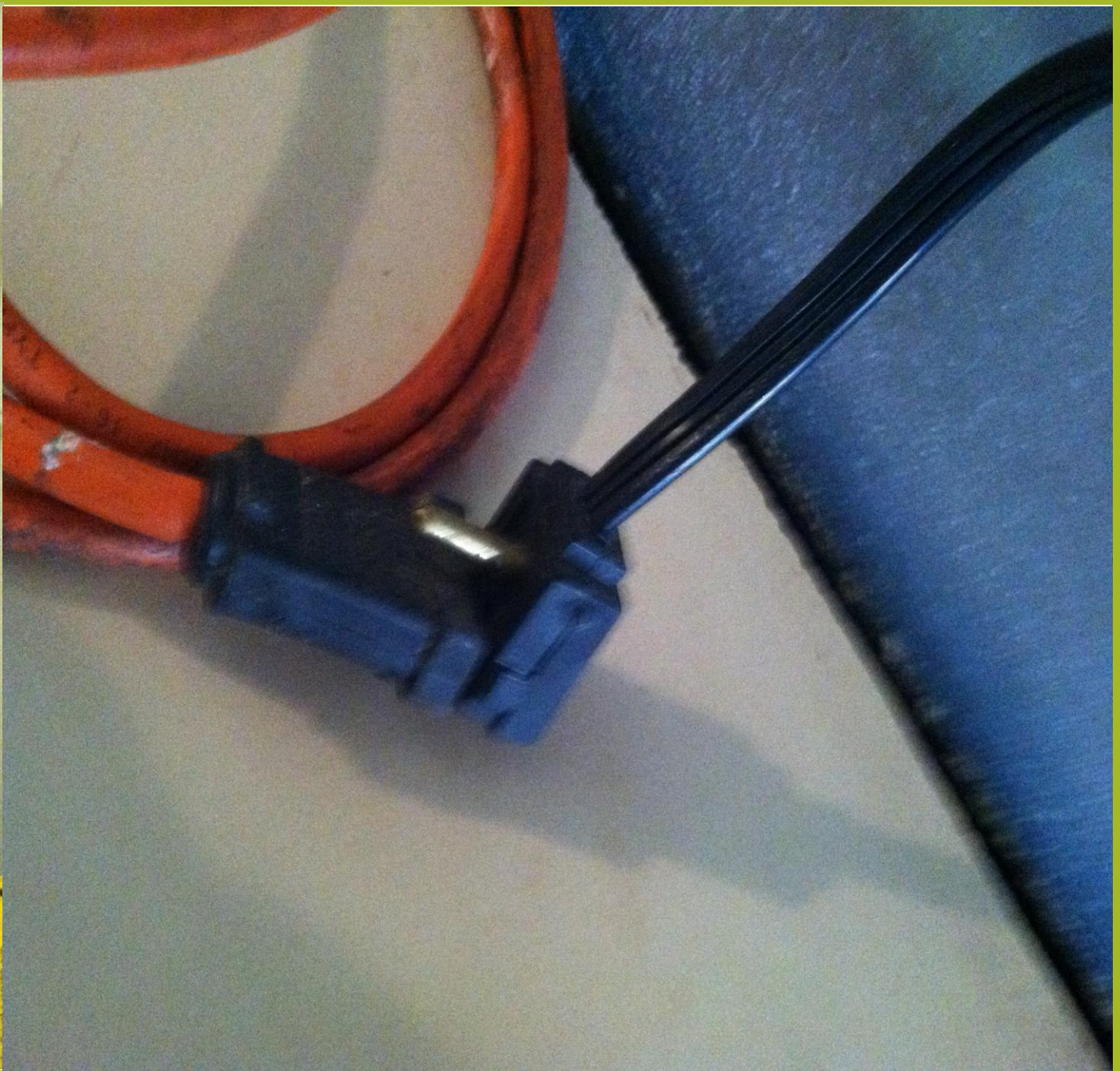
