GENERAL IMMIGRATION UPDATES

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)

- Temporary permission
 - SSN, Work Permit, Michigan ID
- No pathway to permanent residence or citizenship
- DACA was <u>terminated</u> by current administration <u>but</u>, currently, renewals are being accepted under pending federal court cases



Consult with attorney before renewing

Updates on Temporary Protected Status (TPS)

- Sudan: ends Nov. 2, 2018
- Nicaragua: ends Jan. 5, 2019
- **Nepal:** ends June 24, 2019
- Haiti: ends July 22, 2019
- El Salvador: ends Sept. 9. 2019
- Honduras: ends Jan. 5, 2020

<u>Upcoming TPS decision dates:</u>

- July 5, 2018: Yemen
- July 19, 2018: Somalia
- March 3, 2019: South Sudan
- August 1, 2019: Syria

ICE Raids at Work


- ICE must have a judicial warrant to enter private property (including land) or be given permission to enter by the owner of the property.
- If housing is provided onsite, or as part of contract with employee, ICE must have a judicial warrant or the resident's permission to enter.

ICE Raids at Work


- What to do during a workplace raid?
 - Do not panic. Do not run away. Individuals can ask if they are free to leave. If the officer says no, do not try to leave.
 - If questioned, can say "I'm choosing to remain silent" or show a rights card.
 - Do not show false documents. Do not lie.



- REAL ID Act new national standards for driver's licenses and state IDs to be accepted for official federal purposes
- Michigan issues both REAL ID-compliant licenses/IDs and standard, non-REAL ID licenses/IDs.
- Standard Michigan licenses/IDs are valid forms of identification.
 - However, beginning October 2020, standard Michigan licenses that are not REAL-ID compliant, will no longer be valid for official federal purposes (ie at federal facilities, at airport)

 How do you tell the difference between a Michigan REAL ID compliant and non-compliant license?





Applying for a license or ID? You will need the documents listed below.



To ensure your application process is as smooth as possible, remember:

- Double-check that you have all the correct document ation before visting a Secretary of State office. If you have any questions about what is required, please visit the Secretary of State website at www.Michigan.gov/sos or call the Department of State Information Center at 888-505-MICH (167-6424).
- ✓ Your first and last name and date of birth on your legal presence and identity documents should match. If your current legal name is different from the name on your birth certificate or legal presence document, you must show legal proof of the name change, such as an original marriage certificate, divorce decree or court order.
- ✓ A second document from group #2 may also be accepted as proof of identity.
- √ Foreign documents must be translated.
- Documents must be originals or copies certified with a raised seal or stamp. Faxed or photoc opied documents will NOT be accepted.
- Foreign driver's licenses are proof of driving experience only. English translations must be provided if you do not have an International Driving Permit.
- Documents are subject to departmental review and may require more than one day for approvals. Additional information may be required. The department may retain images or copies of documents presented.

Your Social Security number or letter of ineligibility

Present ONE of the following to demonstrate a valid Social Security number or ineligibility.

- Social Security card
- □ W-2 Form
- SSA 1099 form or non-SSA 1099 form
- Pay stub containing your name and Social Security number.
- SSA-L676 letter of ineligibility from the Social Security Administration. Must be presented with USCIS documents that show non-work authorized status. Letters more than 60 days old will not be accepted.

Moder

If you are unable to provide one of the above documents as proof of your Social Security number, other documents that show your Social Security number may be presented but require review by the branch manager. Social Security number information will be verified. You may be required to correct your information with the Social Security Administration before your driver's license or ID card application can be processed.

2 Legal presence

Present at least ONE of any of the documents from this column.

- Valid, unexpired U.S. passport or passport card.
- Certified birth certificate with stamp or raised seal issued by a government unit of the U.S. or U.S. territory government office.
 NOTE: Puerto Rico birth certificates can only
- NOTE: Puerto Rico birth certificates can only be accepted if issued on or after July 1, 2010.

 Enhanced Michigan Driver's License or ID card.
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad issued by the U.S. Department of State (FS-240, DS-1350 or

The following documents are subject to verification using the Systematic Allen Verification for Entitlements System (SAVE). Approval may take longer than one day.

- Valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card (I-551).
- Certificate of Citizenship (N-560 or N-561).
- Certificate of Naturalization (N-550, N-570 or N-578).
- 3 Valid, unexpired foreign passport and U.S.visa with entry stamp or I-94 form.
- 81 and 82 visas are not accepted.
 W8 and WT visa stamps are not accepted.
- F-vise holders must present an I-20 form.
- J-visaholders must present a D5-2019 form.
- Valid, unexpired Employment Authorization
 Card (I-766) presented with foreign passport
 and entry stamp.

Note: If you do not have any of the above documents other LSCS documents may be presented but require verification, which may take more than one day.

3 Identity verification

Present original documents to establish identity. MORETHAN ONE document may be required.

- Out-of-state, U.S. territories, or Canadian driver's license or ID card. (Licenses or ID cards expired for less than four years will be accepted.)
- □ Marriage license issued in the U.S.
 □ Divorce decree issued in the U.S.
- □ U.S. court order for a name change.
 □ Employee photo ID issued by a federal or Michigan government agency.
- U.S. Customs and Border Protection Trusted
 Traveler Card (Global Entry, SENTRI or NEXUS).
- U.S. military ID card with photo (DD-2, DD-1173 or CAC card).
- U.S. military discharge or separation documents, such as a DD-214.
- Tribal photo ID card from a federally recognized.
 Native American tribe.
- Michigan Department of Corrections prisoner ID card. (This document requires verification, which may take more than one day.)
- Michigan driver education certificate. (For applicants age 18 and younger.)
- Government-issued adoption record.
- U.S. school records (School ID cards with name and photo, diplomas, transcripts, yearbooks, or record of attendance).
- If the applicant is below age 18 and does not have one of the above with them, a parent or guardian may present their driver's license or ID and sign for the teen.
- ☐ The identity requirement may also be met if two of the following documents are presented: foreign passport, I-94, Employment Authorization Card, Refugee Travel Document I-571 or Immigrant visa.
- □ A valid, unexpired U.S. passport or passport card can serve as both proof of legal presence and identity.

Note: if none of the documents listed above are available, other identity documents may be accept ed. These documents require verification, which may take more than one day.

4 Proof of Michigan residency

Present at least TWO documents with your name and Michigan residence address.

- Utility bill or credit card bill issued within the last 90 days. (Electronic copies are acceptable.)
- ☐ Account statement from a bank or other financial institution issued within the last 90 days. (Electronic copies are acceptable.)
- Michigan high school, college or university report cards or transorlots.
- Mortgage, lease or rental agreement. (Lease and rental agreements must include the landlord's telephone number.)
- Pay stub or earnings statement issued with the name and address of the employee.
- Life, health, auto or home insurance policy.
- Federal, state or local government documents, such as receipts, licenses or assessments.
- Michigan title and registration. (The registration must show current residential address.)
- Other documents containing your name and address may be accepted with manager approval.

Note: Michigan P.O. baxes not an acarptable residence address.

2 Legal presence

Present at least <u>ONE</u> of any of the documents from this column.

- Valid, unexpired U.S. passport or passport card.
- Certified birth certificate with stamp or raised seal issued by a government unit of the U.S. or U.S. territory government office.

NOTE: Puerto Rico birth certificates can only be accepted if issued on or after July 1, 2010.

- Enhanced Michigan Driver's License or ID card.
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad issued by the U.S. Department of State (FS-240, DS-1350 or FS-545).

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- Certificate of Citizenship (N-560 or N-561).
- Certificate of Naturalization (N-550, N-570 or N-578).
- Valid, unexpired foreign passport and U.S.visa with entry stamp or I-94 form.
 - B1 and B2 visas are not accepted.
 - WB and WT visa stamps are not accepted.
 - F-visa holders must present an I-20 form.
 - J-visa holders must present a DS-2019 form.
- Valid, unexpired Employment Authorization
 Card (I-766) presented with foreign passport
 and entry stamp.

Note: If you do not have any of the above documents other USCIS documents may be presented but require verification, which may take more than one day.

Issues at SoS?

Ask for a <u>branch manager</u> and to have your documents sent through the <u>exceptions process</u>

PROPOSED CHANGES TO PUBLIC CHARGE

What is public charge?

Public Charge is an immigration law concept.

One of the requirements for getting permanent residence (aka a "green card"): prove applicant is not likely to become primarily dependent on the government for subsistence.



Public Charge Under Current Law

May consider limited public benefits:

- Cash assistance (i.e. FIP, SSI), or
- Medicaid long-term care institutionalized care (e.g. nursing home)

But can respond with "affidavit of support" from sponsor (sponsor makes income available to applicant for green card/LPR)

<u>Final decision</u> must look at "totality of circumstances" (past vs. current vs. future situation; age, family, health status, employment, etc.)

Public charge does not apply to...

- Refugees and asylees
- VAWA self-petitioners
- Victims of human trafficking (T- Visas)
- Victims of Crime (U-Visas)
- Special immigrant juveniles (SIJ)
- Applicants for Temporary Protected Status (TPS) who receive a waiver

- Afghan and Iraqi special immigrants serving as translators with U.S.
- Cuban and Haitian entrants
- Central Americans adjusting as part of NACARA
- LPRs applying for U.S. citizenship
- American Indians born in Canada
- Certain Nationals of Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos
- Qualified aliens
- And others

The law has not changed

...however a there's a proposal to change the law that could have devastating consequences.

Proposed changes

Current Law

 Cash assistance programs including SSI, FIP, Institutionalized care at government expense

Proposed New Regulation

- Cash assistance programs (including TANF, SSI)
- Earned Income Tax Credit
- ACA/Obamacare (federal subsidies/ tax credits)
- Food Stamps
- Medicaid
- WIC
- Housing assistance
- LIHEAP energy benefits
- Institutionalization for short- and long-term care at government expense
- Includes benefits received by dependent children

Process for Regulation Change

- **Step 1:** Department of Homeland Security (DHS) sent a proposed regulation to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). Slated to be published in July but could be published any day.
- **Step 2:** Publish for notice and comment: 30-60 days to send public comments on the proposed regulation
- **Step 3:** DHS has to respond to the public comments (does not mean they will consider/change proposed regulation) and publish a *final regulation*. Could take several months.

Going through consular processing

Starting to hear about changes at some consulates

- Rule is expected to be <u>prospective</u>
- No changes to <u>eligibility</u> for any government programs

Example: effectiveness of comments

- Tip theft rule (was proposed December 2017)
- National Employment Law Project (their partners) generated over 300,000 comments
 - These comments elevated the profile of the issue and put pressure on Congress to act.
 - The omnibus spending bill which passed this year included a provision which codified tip protections for workers.
