Subject: Removal of Copayment for Drugs Used to Treat Substance Use

Disorder (Including Tobacco Use Disorder)

Effective: As Indicated

Programs Affected: Medicaid, Healthy Michigan Plan, Children's Special Health Care

Services (CSHCS), Maternity Outpatient Medical Services (MOMS)

NOTE: Implementation of this policy is contingent upon approval of a State Plan Amendment by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

Effective for dates of service on or after April 1, 2020, no copayment will be charged to beneficiaries for drug products used to treat Substance Use Disorder, including Tobacco Use Disorder. The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) is implementing this copayment exemption to eliminate financial barriers to these types of drugs, which will increase access to care.

Drugs that are exempt from copayment requirements will be identified on the Michigan Pharmaceutical Products List (MPPL) as "No" under the "Copay" column. The MPPL can be found at Michigan.magellanrx.com >> Provider Portal >> Documents >> Fee-for-Service Drug Coverage.
