INCREASED TRAINING

436 Care Managers, including 172 SIM Care Managers, trained by the Michigan Care Management Resource Center. 200 Community Health Workers trained by the Michigan Community Health Worker Alliance statewide.



DASHBOARD EXPANDED TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL MEASURES

45 measures available on the dashboard; 30 new measures added including Ambulatory Care Sensitive Admissions, Total Cost, and Preventable Emergency Department Visits. Quality measure information integrated to support outcome measures.



SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH SCREENING PROGRESS

Michigan Department of Health and Human Services added new screening domains to address patient needs. Participants made progress in improving systematic screening processes to screen entire patient population by the end of the demonstration.



SUCCESSFUL COMMUNITY-CLINICAL LINKAGE PARTNERSHIP

Participants in the health screening data exchange collaborated with multiple vendors to submit client-level data for qualitative analyses of services provided.
