

State Opioid Response No Cost Extension

Past 30 day opioid use by treatment non-complete vs. discharge clients

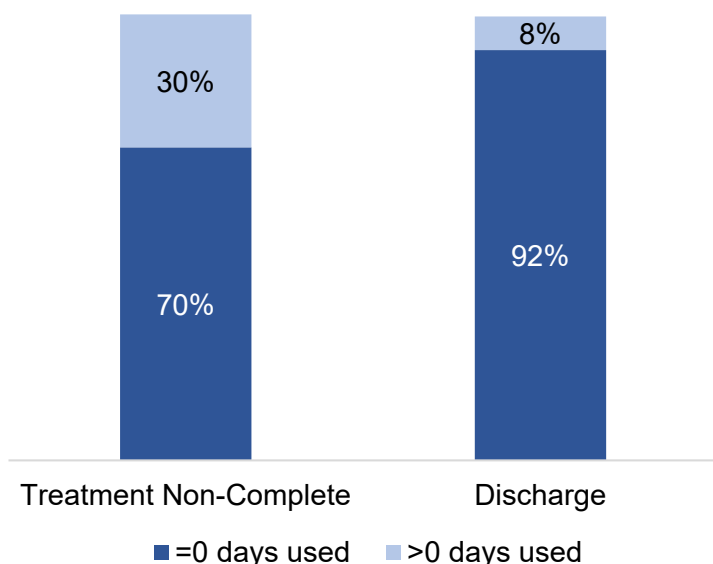
This graphic compares opioid use in the past 30 days between treatment non-complete clients and clients discharged from programming. Treatment non-complete clients have either been terminated from programming or stopped engaging in programming. These clients are no longer receiving services.

- Most treatment non-complete clients and discharged clients report no opioid use.
- Heroin is the most commonly used opioid for treatment non-complete and discharged clients, followed by Oxycontin/Oxycodone and Percocet.
- Treatment non-complete clients reported higher use rates of heroin, Oxycontin/Oxycodone and Percocet than discharged clients.
- There was no variation in use rates between treatment non-complete and discharged clients for Morphine, Codeine, Dilaudid, Tylenol 2,3,4, and Non-prescribed Methodone.
- Neither group reported using Darvon or Demerol.

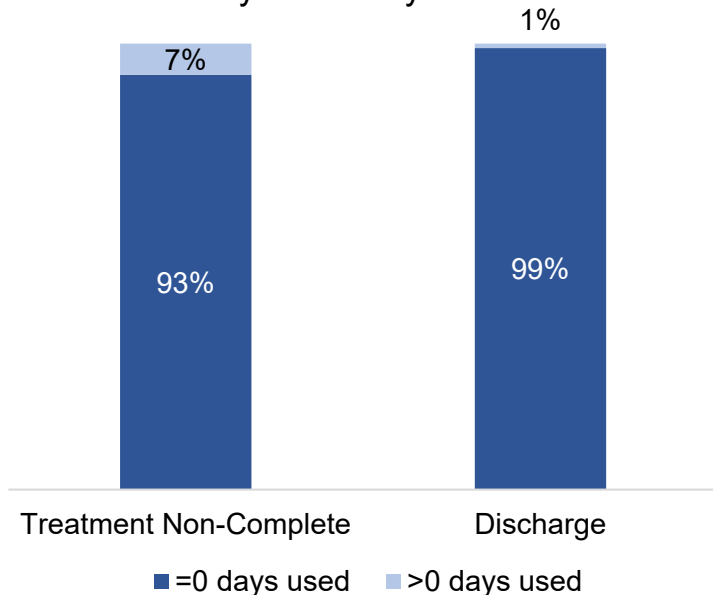
Lower opioid use rates among discharged clients could indicate program completion contributes to lower opioid use rates.

The disparity in use among heroin and prescription opioids implies more clients are obtaining opioids illicitly, rather than through prescription channels.
