Vision for a Five-Year Health IT Roadmap: A Brief History

2005

- Governor Jennifer Granholm announces efforts to explore the role of IT in healthcare transformation and improving care outcomes
- The Michigan Department of Community Health and Department of Information Technology are charged with convening stakeholders to develop a strategy

2006

- 200+ healthcare stakeholders are convened
- The "Conduit to Care" strategy document is published
- The legislature establishes the Health IT Commission
- Federal and state funding is secured to implement plans

Vision for a Five-Year Health IT Roadmap: Strategic Planning During a Global Pandemic

2019

- The Health IT Commission adopts a resolution to update the "Conduit to Care" strategy
- The Michigan Health Endowment Fund awards funding for the development of an updated Statewide Health IT Roadmap

2020

- The coronavirus pandemic causes engagement and discovery for the Statewide Roadmap to be reimagined for virtual spaces
- 650+ healthcare, social service, community nonprofits, state and local agencies and consumer stakeholders are engaged......THANK YOU!


49 attendees from public health, health IT, hospitals, and other sectors





Identified key issues and opportunities related to public health and health IT





Theme #1 – State Data Sharing for COVID-19 Response and Tracking



- On a scale of 1 5, the state's data sharing for COVID-19 response was rated a 3
- The state has done a decent job, but some improvements are needed:
 - Michigan Disease Surveillance System (MDSS) could be more stable; downtime impacts contact tracing
 - TraceForce needs streamlining; could benefit from regional "heatmap" of positive results
 - Reportable lab system data may not be included in MiHIN reports; need integrated data reports
 - Improve state communications and coordination; act as a "command center", including for laboratory testing (supplies, reagents, capacity, etc.)

Theme #2 – Health IT Investments During the Pandemic

A large majority of respondents indicated the pandemic has **not** made it a priority for them to invest in new health IT systems

- COVID-19 caused major hit to organizations' revenue
- Organizations were required to make better use of existing tools, like telehealth
- Some local public health need extensive new investments in health IT due to historical underinvestment; however, they have largely depended on state systems (e.g., MDSS, MCIR)



Theme #3 – Community Partnerships and Information Sharing

- 63% responded "somewhat" to feeling like they had partnerships and information sharing protocols necessary for efficient COVID-19 response:
 - Desire to make better use of MiHIN data for COVID-19 tracking and receiving targeted regional information
 - Public-private partnerships have been critical; need facilitation of more transparent resource coordination
- Desire for "Regional Command Centers"
 - Need to understand capacity and constraints in various organizations; better coordinate resources
 - Better distribution of supplies, routing of patients to testing tents, results reporting, etc.




Theme #4 – Systems for Responding to Outbreaks

- Most indicated "unsure" or "no" regarding receiving information necessary to help manage or prevent future COVID-19 outbreaks
- Local public health uses TraceForce and Outbreak Management System, which feed into the Michigan Disease Surveillance System, to coordinate with providers
- A number of different systems are needed to effectively manage a COVID-19 outbreak: case management, medical management, and proximity tracing systems
- Organizations report vaccine administration to the Michigan Care Improvement Registry through web entry/upload or utilize HL7 messaging through a health information exchange



Not all local public health departments in the state use TraceForce.


Should all local public health departments be required to use TraceForce? What specific improvements need to be made to TraceForce to make it a more impactful tool?




Future Health IT Investments in Public Health

In your region, what are the top three priority health IT investments in light of COVID-19? Why are those the top priorities?



High Level Timeline for Roadmap Development Process

September 2021 Final Draft Roadmap for HITC and MDHHS acceptance/approval

Q2 2021 - Q3 2021

- Draft Roadmap with recommendations for HITC consideration
- Present draft Roadmap to HITC
- Conduct feedback process to validate stakeholder support for Roadmap
- Make necessary revisions

Q3 2020 - Q1 2021

- Engage Stakeholders in Environmental Scan
- Review historical documents
- Synthesize input
- Ensure "directional correctness" with guidance from RSC
- Update HITC




