Injury Prevention

Indicator(s): 325.132(3)(c)(ii)(A)203.5 The RTN has developed a written injury prevention and control plan that is coordinated with other agencies and community health programs in the region. The injury prevention program is data driven and targeted programs are developed based upon high injury risk areas. Specific goals with measurable objectives are incorporated into the injury prevention plan.

Progress: Regional injury prevention plan was completed in 2017. Currently under revision. No activities planned due to COVID-19 pandemic.

Communications

Indicator(s): 325.132(3)(c)(ii)(C)302.10 There are established procedures for EMS and trauma system communications for major EMS events or multiple jurisdiction incidents that are effectively coordinated with the overall regional response plans.

Progress: All hospitals participate in the regional healthcare coalition monthly communication exercises. Currently exploring degree of inclusion of EMS agencies.

Infrastructure

Indicator(s): 325.132(3)202.2 The RTN has developed and implemented a multi-disciplinary, multi-agency Regional Trauma Advisory Council to provide overall guidance for trauma system planning and implementation. The committee meets regularly and is responsible for providing guidance to the RTN.

Progress: Leadership for RTN, RTAC, and committees appointed.

Regional Performance Improvement

Indicator(s): 325.132(3)(c)(ii)(I)206.1 No less than once per year, the RTN generates data reports that are disseminated to all trauma system stakeholders to evaluate and improve system performance.

Progress: RPSRO has not been meeting. RTN Board and RTAC receive regular updates on data submission by the hospitals from the Regional Trauma Coordinators which address participation and timeliness.

Continuum of Care

Indicator(s): Indicator 308.1: The regional workplan addresses the integration and participation of rehabilitation services within the continuum of care for trauma patients.

Progress: There has been no forward movement on this indicator.

Trauma Education

<p>Indicator(s): 325.132(3)(c)(ii)(J)310.(3)(4)(6) The regional trauma network establishes and ensures that appropriate levels of EMS, nursing and physician trauma training courses are provided on a regular basis.</p>
<p>Progress: Munson Medical Center in partnership with McLaren Northern Michigan are positioning themselves to fill some gaps in availability of trauma certification programs such as ATLS, TNCC, and RTDDC. Opportunities there along with others statewide are shared on a regular basis with regional stakeholders. On hold during COVID-19 pandemic.</p>
