## Welcome and Introductions

Debi Cain convened the April 28, 2017 Sexual Assault Evidence Kit Tracking and Reporting Commission at the Michigan State Police Headquarters, 7150 Harris Drive, Dimondale, Michigan 48821 at 1:38 p.m. Introductions were made and a welcome extended to guests.

Roll call was taken and there was not a quorum for this meeting.

# Project Updates:

J. Nye from the Michigan State Police, Forensic Science Division, reported on the request for proposal (RFP) for a statewide electronic tracking system. After review by the Michigan State Police and the Michigan Domestic and Sexual Violence Prevention and Treatment Board the RFP language has been finalized as of April 2017. The RFP will be published in May then bids will be received in June. Bids will be evaluated from June through August 2017.

M. Morrow, Bureau of Justice Assistance Sexual Assault Kit Initiative (SAKI) Project Director at the Prosecuting Attorney Association of Michigan, reported on the status of auditing and testing un-submitted Sexual Assault Examination Kits. The project has three main objectives:

- 1. To conduct a statewide inventory of all Sexual Assault Evidence Kits that had never been submitted for testing.
- 2. To track all testing outcomes.
- 3. To provide training to medical providers, law enforcement, victim advocates and prosecutors on issues pertaining to sexual assault kits.

M. Morrow said that there are approximately 15,000 total unsubmitted Sexual Assault Evidence Kits that have been found statewide including Detroit and Flint. The Michigan State Police have already processed 11,341 of these Sexual Assault Evidence kits. She explained the inventory process of the remaining 3,433 un-submitted Sexual Assault Evidence Kits. As of April 27, 2017,

there have been 1,290 Sexual Assault Evidence Kits tested resulting in 333 CODIS eligible profiles.

The SAKI project has partnered with MCOLES to provide training on the Sexual Assault Kit Evidence Submission Act and the Sexual Assault Victim's Access to Justice Act at every sexual assault training that MCOLES presents throughout the state. The SAKI project is also partnering with PAAM's Violence Against Women Project to provide one day multi-disciplinary trainings. Victim notification trainings are also provided by the SAKI project.

Lore Rogers, Board Staff to the Commission, provided an update on the work of the Committee on storage of unreleased Sexual Assault Evidence Kits. Committee members met together on March 6, 2017 and April 14, 2017 and decided that a central repository for unreleased Sexual Assault Evidence Kits is preferred. The committee is opposed to law enforcement being responsible for storing unreleased Sexual Assault Evidence Kits.

A survey will be prepared and distributed to hospitals and SANE programs throughout the state. The main purpose of the survey is to learn the policies and practices regarding storage of unreleased Sexual Assault Evidence Kits in those institutions as well as the transmission of released kits. If a central repository for unreleased Sexual Assault Evidence Kits is decided upon it may be necessary to amend the current law requiring hospitals and health care providers to hold unreleased Sexual Assault Evidence Kits for up to a year.
