OROSC Updates – Angie Smith-Butterwick for Larry Scott

- **State Targeted Response (STR) Grant** – The 80/20 split is now relaxed on prevention and treatment funding.
- **Syringe Services** – In the process of amending our Block Grant application to include Syringe Services for the Prepaid Inpatient Health Plan (PIHP) regions. Cannot pay for needle exchange but can pay for associate services. Must submit by July 2018.

Emerging Issues and Trends - Su Min Oh/Patrick Hindman/Group

Opioids and Prescription Drugs, Alcohol, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - Su Min Oh/Group

- **Prescription Drugs** –
 - Senator Rick Jones' webpage, an antidepressant drug that was not regulated by the FDA, called Stablon, Coaxil and the chemical name is Tianeptine sodium is now a Schedule 2 drug (available through a prescription only).
 - **Town Hall** will take place next week on prescription drugs in Warren Centerline, per Dawn of Macomb.
 - **Lenawee** is hosting an opioid summit that will be attended by Jane Goerge.
 - **Opioid Public Safety Summit** - Public Health Admin had this event that Joe attended and gave a brief overview. He will pass the slides on to the SEOW members.

- **Heroin – N/A**
- **Legalizing Marijuana –**
 - **Marijuana Shops** - 250 medical marijuana shops are now closed, most in Detroit.
 - **High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area program (HIDTA)** - has agreed to come out to SE Michigan on June 1, 2018 and present on what has happened in the business community in Colorado and the issues they are having once they legalized marijuana. Dawn will send the list to Su Min.
- **E-Cigarettes –** Su Min mentioned that the FDA said we specifically focus on JUUL and the flavors Mango, Cool Mint, and Fruit Medley, which are popular among youth. JUUL will be added to the FDA checks. Lisa is checking out whether JUUL nicotine-free is legal or not according to the FDA and will let everyone know.
- **Alcohol –** Patrick said the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA), a branch of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) has accepted upward to 70 million dollars to conduct research from the alcohol industry to show that moderate or light drinking is good for your health. NIH will be investigating.
 - **House Bill 5760**, which states “A PERSON MAY APPLY FOR AND HOLD A CLASS C LICENSE, A SPECIALLY DESIGNATED MERCHANT LICENSE, AND A SPECIALLY DESIGNATED DISTRIBUTOR LICENSE AT THE SAME TIME”. This essentially means that a licensee can sell beer, wine, and spirits for consumption off premise, as well as sell beer, wine, and spirits for consumption on-premise. The SDD and SDM licenses are the off-premise licenses, while the Class C license is meant for a bar/restaurant type of business. This is essentially one way to increase the opportunity for businesses to sell more alcohol without actually increasing the specific number outlets.
 - **Half-Mile Rule** - did not pass.

Partner Updates – All

- **Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP) – Dianne Perukel – Tabled**
- **Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Communicable Disease/HAI, Infectious Diseases Update - Joe Coyle**
 - **HEP A** - As of last Friday, there were 804 cases of HEP A, about 50 percent with substance abuse. He also mentioned the EPI curve and that it shows that the infections are decreasing. Encourages shots in arms, especially the at-risk populations.
 - **National Governor’s Association (NGA)** - As part of the NGA technical assistance (TA) workgroup, Joe and Larry have been assigned a goal to increase statewide harm reduction by identifying areas as follows: **Model One** - expand syringe service programs using STR funding; **Model Two** - opioid health home to increase harm reduction capacity in the pilot in the Northern lower peninsula (MDHHS administration momentum/priority) and as you amend your proposals can be utilized to decide as to where to prioritize. Katie Macomber’s HIV Care and Prevention area has funded four pilot syringe service programs recently in Chippewa Marquette District Health Department #2 and Central Michigan District Health Department and to gather as much information as possible. Another component of the NGA application is educating the Opioid Commission on infectious diseases related to substance abuse where Dr. Wells is scheduled to be on the agenda in the very near future.
- **Bureau of Health and Wellness/Division of Chronic Disease and Injury Control/Tobacco Section/Injury and Violence Prevention Unit – Su Min Oh for Chelsea Walker**
Data Driven Prevention Initiative for Prescription Drug Overdose
 Currently working on the year three continuation application.
- **Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Environmental Health/Environmental Surveillance Section - Tom Largo/A. Miller/Gabrielle Stroh Steiner**
 - **Michigan Opioid Morbidity and Mortality Surveillance**
 Preparing the Continuation application that is due tomorrow. Sarah Rockhill will fill Tom’s old epidemiology opioid surveillance role and is expected to join this group. Gabrielle says the first morbidity data overview was submitted to CDC syndromic data and looking into methods to better use the data. Submitted our data sharing agreement for EMS data; access not determined. Death data access is forthcoming and will update everyone.

Sent to everyone via e-mail. Su Min mentioned the comments received. She continued by explaining how the data has changed over time, changes, and enhancements to the infographic.
