## SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS

### **SEOW Meeting Introductions, Welcome, and Approval of Agenda/Minutes – Joel Hoepfner**

- Joel welcomed members and members and guests introduced themselves.
- Agenda was approved.
- The Minutes of March 15, 2017 were reviewed and HEP D will be changed to HEP C, after which they were approved by consensus.

### **Emerging Issues and Trends - All**

#### **Opioids, Prescription Drugs, Alcohol, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - Su Min Oh/Group**

- **Prescription Drugs** – Legislature; no movement on bills 166 and 167, where physicians will be required to check the Michigan Automated Prescription System (MAPS) prior to prescribing prescription drugs to NEW patients. The new MAPS has been up and running since April 4, 2017.
- **Heroin** – Su Min briefly reviewed the revised five-year data maps on heroin, opioids, and totals. There was some improvement; however, heroin and opioids showed no change. State communication expressed the importance of the utilization of ICD 10 codes or highest rates. Article to be sent to Su Min on Centers for Disease Control (CDC), Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR). Dr. Kapenga suggests a template for all counties to use, such as communities, task forces, etc. Larry says he will follow-up with Dr. Pinals on communicating with physicians. Su Min will look at more recent data; specified and unspecified and compare the two. A strategy will be created.

- **Legalizing Marijuana** – No movement.
- **E-cigarettes** – No movement on Senate bill 37. Su Min informed everyone about the upcoming all region Synar inspections by underage youth to take place in June. Joel mentioned he will be attending an event called the Tobacco Policy Conference put on by Tobacco Free Michigan in Traverse City.
- **Alcohol** – No movement.

### **Partner Updates – All**

#### **Office of Highway Safety Planning** – *Dianne Perukel* Tabled

#### **MDHHS/Viral Hepatitis Surveillance and Prevention Unit (Syringe Service Programs)** – *Joe Coyle*

- The letter of support has been sent, but there are roadblocks concerning jurisdictions, among other red tape.
- There has been an increase in HEP A in the population, of which vaccinations will be administered.
- A new platform for data analytics is forthcoming called Microsoft Power BI software; no timeline is indicated as to how soon it will be available to the entire state of Michigan.

#### **Data Driven Prevention Initiative for Prescription Drug Overdose** – *Adrian Zeh*

- A stakeholder meeting took place in March; 40 were in attendance. Tom Largo presented overdose data on demographics by age groups and race.
- Annual report due to the Centers for Disease Control on April 20.
- More data is needed at the local level. Will share with Su Min.
- MAPS rollout is proceeding well. Weekly meetings will take place where data will be shared with those interested. Su Min indicates that demographic data by age mortality (opioid) will be shared with all interested parties next month. Converting 2016 MAPS presentation data by zip code (always available) added to existing 2016 MAPS data by county.

#### **Michigan Primary Care Association (MPCA)** – *Joe Tran*

In Joe's absence, Su Min reported for Joe on the MPCA report annual report will be coming out later this summer that will have the key findings from the federally qualified health care clinics in Michigan. Joe will share with the group.

### **Practical Tool Development** – *Joel Hoepfner*

Per Joel, practical tool development indicators list has been shared. Su Min distributed, reviewed, and explained a document called, *Current Opioid Surveillance Efforts* and their indicators from four regions that also includes the Central Data Repository (CDR). She reviewed and explained/defined each heading on page two and gathered ideas from SEOW members, as well as offered examples. Su Min said based on the suggested ideas, she will prepare two rows; already available (primary, secondary, tertiary), other considerations, gaps and opportunities.
