### **SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS**

## SEOW Meeting Approval of Agenda/Minutes – Su Min Oh

➤ Su Min chaired today's meeting in the absence of Joel. Today's Agenda and the Minutes of April 20, 2016 were reviewed and approved by consensus.

# **Update on Next Steps/Action Items from Previous Meeting**

- > Su Min will follow-up on the Michigan Profile for Healthy Youth (MiPHY) Data Trends on E-Cig.
- ➤ Data Received, Shared, and Discussed is tabled until the June 15, 2016 meeting.
- ➤ The Overdose Deaths Fact Sheet is in Communications for approval. After approval it will be posted on the OROSC website and widely shared.
- Emergency Room System Su Min has contacted the guest speaker and the next step will be to arrange a time for her to come and present her research.

# **OROSC Updates** – *Larry Scott*

Substance Abuse Mental Health and Substance Abuse Administration (SAMHSA) - Prescription Drug and Overdose Prevention Grant — We are on draft number seven of the grant and moving toward closure. Su Min will speak to where we are on the process to select communities. For planning we chose not to participate in the selection process early on, but were able to mine the data at the start, but discovered that we could use the process we already had in place. This problem of prescription drug and opioid abuse is prevalent all ten PIHP regions. We will be using the governor's prescription drug and opioid overdose drug advisory council. Grants management will be submitting the grant, which is due May 31, 2016. Members had no questions.

### **Emerging Issues and Trends**

### Opioids, Prescription Drugs, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - Su Min Oh

- **Prescription Drugs** Emergency Medical Service (EMS) data is available and will be included in today's discussion. Liz states that President Obama has designated an extra \$1 billion toward Medication Assisted Treatment.
- ➤ **Heroin** The HIV section is having conversations with the Center for Disease Control (CDC) to use some of their funding for the syringe exchange program.
- Legalizing Marijuana Rachel reports that there has been no movement on bills or legislation. A moratorium has been placed on legalizing marijuana dispensaries in Lansing. Dawn reports about her region 9 on the subject of legalizing marijuana, which included strategies on educating the public, talking to parents, link between marijuana and future opioid use, and the associated consequences. Planning a June 10<sup>th</sup> statewide meeting. They will be creating a fact sheet. Craig Summer from the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area program (HIDTA) was asked to speak at the June 10<sup>th</sup> meeting, but he will not be available, however, he is willing to share his PowerPoint. Dianne shared that she compiled a percentage of patients afflicted with each debilitating condition of marijuana patients which Dianne will e-mail to everyone. Also OHSP is working with the University of Michigan Transportation Research Institute (UMTRI) on compiling county level profiles of marijuana involved crashes and the draft has been reviewed. Will also lists the number of card holders and caregivers in a county. In addition the American Automobile Association (AAA) sent out a report that there is no real safe level of a Nano gram level yet. There is a bill about figuring out about what a Nano gram should look like for Michigan and Nano gram is not a science driven policy. Will send out news articles on crashes to Dawn and Jane and anyone else who is interested. Will also send UMTRI report to everyone. We will also be monitoring marijuana prevalence and capacity in our system. Michigan State Police (MSP) is aware of the ramifications of legalizing marijuana and are one of the only ones qualified to speak on it. The members welcomed Dianne to the SEOW.

Su Min shares with the group we are monitoring the prevalence of marijuana use and treatment capacity within our system. The prevalence for the past month/years has been increasing since 2012 according to the NSDUH. Treatment and episode data was the opposite; decreasing.

- ➤ E-cigarettes No new information nor movement on house or senate bills. FDA acknowledges that e-cigarettes is a tobacco product and will eventually have to be included in our tobacco inspections. Other states have done pilot inspections and the violations were high. Larry emphasized the need to include vendors that sell e-cigarettes/vapor to the retailer lists. FDA is starting to use the term "ENDS" Electronic Nicotine Delivery System.
- ➤ **Alcohol** EPI position has not been filled yet, however, we are hopeful it will be filled soon.

## County Ranking Indicators – Su Min Oh

Su Min went over a handout on county ranking indicators with the group on four major indicators. This is not on the Central Data Repository (CDR). Liz states this data is on the CDR. Larry suggests the EMS would be a good source to track Narcan use. Su Min gets opinions from the group if this a good way to identify the high need communities for the PDO. Someone suggests counties be weighted. More discussion on county data, such as just because a person secures a prescription is not necessarily where they overdose. A suggestion was made to go with opioid prescriptions written as a leading measure to determine highest activity, as there are other variables to be considered, such as the person's ability to fill a prescription, among others. Discussion about what to focus on for the PDO; prescriptions written, all ten PIHPs, etc. Kelli suggests prescriptions written is a leading measure and the others are a lagging measure, and this is the benchmark for where you are now, but once the PIHPs get new money, there is an expectation that the numbers decline. Larry shares how Medicaid is expanding or will be moving toward a Lock-In program where you limit the number of prescribers per Medicaid beneficiaries and pharmacies (limited to one prescriber and pharmacy) which minimizes access points and is a good metric and strategy, known as an intervening variable, by which through the Benefits Monitoring System these individuals can be tracked and know who the high utilizers are. Su Min will add poverty information.

# Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (MiBRFS) – 2014 Results by PIHP – Su Min Oh

Su Min went over the results of the MIBRFS from 2014 and explained three tables; stating the questions; such as lifetime use of drugs and the categories and differences related to the results.

## Michigan EMS Information System (MI-EMSIS) – Narcan administration by county – Su Min Oh

Data has been received from the MI-EMSIS. Su Min shared with the group the data and said that the results were in real time. Su Min also explained the results. If anyone has questions, please let Su Min know.

## Young Adult Survey on Substance Use - Liz Agius and Brooke Dudek

**CDR Update** – Tags fixed. Table and chart function of heroin death data/opioid related deaths is down and will be fixed soon. Nick is updating the style sheet. Working on information boxes for each county and making them more detailed. Liz advises everyone to clear their caches by going to "options" for their browser.

Michigan Young Adult Survey – Liz explains that young people are not using Facebook during daytime hours. Young people use Facebook on their cell phones. There were 1100 participants; 264 males and 847 females; due to these results the next survey will be males only. We discovered that marijuana use is more problematic/prevalent than alcohol use. 69% reported obtaining prescription drugs from family and friends; 1% used heroin. Where respondents came from: 23% from Facebook, 30% were referred them to the site; and 31% college or university flyer. There is a lot of qualitative data that we are preparing. These results were presented to the school of nursing. The results will also be presented at the Social Work Conference in New Orleans and the Michigan SUD Conference. Liz also shares with the group about the benefits of advertising through Facebook as far as survey response frequency and cost. A question was asked about a response rate in a zip code as to whether these can be weighted. Liz responded that Brooke will be working on this. If any of you are interested in conducting more survey efforts on your own you may do so. A report will be created for OROSC and broken out for other communities. They survey is not closed, but is not being advertised. This survey timeframe was for two weeks, but was advertised for 30 days and started at the end of 2015. Will let Su Min know specific dates the survey was conducted. It was funded through the PFS II. Additional costs were funded through Liz's account. If needed, Larry suggests to Kelli that some of the funding come through the PFS 2015-2020.
