#### Update on Next Steps/Action Items from Previous Meeting – Joel Hoepfner

- ➤ Update marijuana indicator List and bring to next meeting Su Min
  - The University of Michigan (U of M) Injury Prevention Center is considering with an idea for a *Marijuana Impact Baseline Report* for the state of Michigan and a list of indicators that focus on the following; prevention, use, social impact, health care settings, driving, legal, and economic, among others. More information is forthcoming.

- ➤ Share Toolkit Rita Seith

In the process of creating a needs assessment that will be sent out to Prepaid Inpatient Health Plans (PIHPs) and locating Health departments. Will be collaborating with prevention team and OROSC. A meeting will

take place with OROSC members to discuss the toolkit needs assessment. She also communicated more information about the toolkit. Future updates will be presented. Joel suggested a visit to the Central Data Suppository (CDR) as a resource regarding toolkits.

## **OROSC Updates** – Angie Smith-Butterwick for Larry Scott

- ➤ Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) Angie presented an update regarding CSTE; awaiting a final signed project contract.
- ➤ Contracts Submitted various financial products through EGrAMS, such as the State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis (STR) Grant, State Opioid Response (SOR) Grant, and SOR Supplemental no-cost extensions, and master agreements. New processes are taking place between Strategic Information Gathering for Management Action (SIGMA) and the best method to utilize EGrAMS.

# Emerging Issues and Trends - Su Min Oh/Patrick Hindman/Alia Lucas/Group Opioids and Prescription Drugs, Alcohol, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - Su Min Oh/Group

➤ Fact Sheet - Su Min

## ➤ Prescription Drugs – Su Min Oh

The Rx Drug Abuse and Heroin Summit (https://www.rx-summit.com/) took place in Atlanta, Georgia in April 2019. Brittany shared with everyone a brief synopsis of the conference, such as a large Michigan presence (approximately 55), collaborative partners, second level of data provisions, future, collection of emergency departments (ED), not the Emergency Medical System (EMS), among other useful information relative to this conference. Su Min explained that this was a prescription drug and heroin summit, organized by congressman Hal Rogers of Kentucky, approximately 4,000 in attendance, there were various tracts and agencies in one place, such as the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), Food and Drug Administration (FDA), federal, treatment, clinician, among many others.

#### ➤ Heroin - Tabled

#### > Marijuana Use

Tom Largo stated that Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) is in the process of developing a new "use" definition, for codes. Information on ED visits pertaining to marijuana was explained, and age range for ED was not determined. Also, other information was related.

# **E-Cigarettes -** *Tabled*

#### ➤ **Alcohol** – *Patrick Hindman*

Senate bill 296 has been proposed which will eliminate the quota system; remove three license types Off-Premise (Specially Designated Distributors, Specially Designated Merchant) and on premise. Proposed a .05 law; the new legal limit for driving. The Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) bill passed the House. The hours of sale bill are now statewide. Alteration of our laws is eminent. Site visits and Shoalition went well.

### Partner Updates -All

➤ Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP) – Christy Sanborn – Tabled (42.10)

Michigan impaired driving program assessment by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration took place.

# ➤ Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Communicable Disease/HAI, Infectious Diseases Update – Joe Coyle/Seth Eckel

- Syringe Service Programs (SSPs) Brandon reported on the second quarter count for the Syringe Service Programs (SSPs) 14,000 syringes from local health departments, 109 legacy sites, one new program that started up in the last quarter in the Central Michigan Health Department in Mount Pleasant.
- **Regional Harm Reduction -** meetings are underway.
- **Hepatitis** C County level vulnerability assessment for jurisdictions most at risk for rapid disseminations cessation for those who inject drugs is complete. Registration information for regional harm reduction meetings will be sent to Su Min.
- Media Campaign Kicking off a media campaign early next month and the launch of the Harm Reduction website should coincide with this media campaign. Mention of media campaign for next year is included in the recently submitted CDC Overdose Data to Action Grant 1904 and working to set-up new harm reduction contracts for FY 2020 with recently improved/received SOR funding. A new intern is reviewing International Classification of Diseases (ICD) 10 codes looking for injection related injuries, such as soft tissue, among other non-death related injuries.
- Syringe Service Program (SSP) SSPs to set-up data in a centralized database for updated data on current substance use trends; aggregate data, demographics, as well as other areas in real-time data. Planning for September start.

# > Bureau of Health and Wellness/Division of Chronic Disease and Injury Control/Tobacco Section/Injury and Violence Prevention Unit – Desiree McLain

• Data Driven Prevention Initiative for Prescription Drug Overdose

Tom reported that Overdose Data to Action Grant was submitted on May 2, 2019; three-year period; seven million per year. More information was related to the group regarding grant funding for the various programs, as well as other states. Rapid reporting from medical examiners. Other discussion and information also communicated to the group. Will be delivering updates on the Syndromic Surveillance and the Overdose Data to Action Grant.

# > Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Environmental Health/Environmental Surveillance Section – Tom Largo/Rita Seith for Gabrielle Stroh Steiner

• Michigan Opioid-Involved Morbidity and Mortality Surveillance (MOMMS)

Currently disseminates monthly syndromic surveillance reports for drug overdose to state or local partners. Changes regarding case definition are coming.

#### > State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis Grant (Opioid STR) – Alicia Goodman

• A PowerPoint will be distributed on this subject to everyone after today's meeting. Alicia filled everyone in on the details of the STR grant; started in 2017, two years, applied for a no-cost extension for 12 months until April 30, 2020 for 21.7 Million dollars, three areas of intervention; prevention, treatment, and recovery initiatives, a statewide media campaign released in April 2019, PIHPs and the hospital locations within the various regions, for instance, McLaren in Region 9, to name one.

Also described was the accomplishments and training that took place within the various programs and the number of participants trained.

### ➤ State Opioid Response Grant (SOR) – Kelsey Schell

Kelsey described this grant in its entirety. Some of the descriptions included; it is Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) related, the focus and goals were explained, 27 Million per grant year, with sixteen months duration, prevention initiatives include PIHPs and non-PIHP partners focusing on core evidencebased programming. Education and training include PIHP regional communities, such as police departments, fire departments, and educating fast food restaurateurs (giving out NALOXONE kits for people overdosing in these places of business). In addition, a description of the various program detail was shared, such as the Office of Medical Affairs, Michigan State University Extension, Michigan Collaborative Addiction Resources and Education System (CARES), which is a collaboration between Michigan State University and Spectrum Health, University of Michigan's, Opioid Prescribing Engagement Network (OPEN), a pain brochure, among others. The Office of Communications is also conducting/creating a statewide media campaign, targeting Stigma and opioid use disorder patients. A flyer will be displayed in waiting rooms. Also described was various funding and how it is being utilized, such as the Intertribal Council and their initiatives, along with others. The SOR Supplemental was also described, which will start in June or July 2019, which includes Syringe Services harm reduction, among other initiatives. Further discussion took place between various participants on this subject.
