SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS

SEOW Meeting Introductions, Welcome, and Approval of Agenda/Minutes – *Joel Hoepfner*

- Joel welcomed members and members and guests introduced themselves.
- Agenda review added approval of April 19 and May 2017 meeting minutes.
- The Minutes of April 19, 2017 and May 17, 2017 were approved.

Update on Next Steps/Action Items from Previous Meeting – *Joel Hoepfner*

- Opioid tab on Central Data Repository- Shared with SEOW members

OROSC Updates – *Su Min Oh*

State Targeted Response (STR) to the Opioid Crisis Grant – Based on the shared STR grant information in everyone's possession, the status of the grant was explained. The departmental opioid data group is now looking at the data inventory. Tom adds that from the Governor's office there is a desire for a dashboard with a comprehensive data query system, where any question can be answered. After that question, a list of questions was identified. Su Min says the opioid data group who we will be working closely with under the direction of the Commission. Joel says the Blue Cross Health Endowment Fund has another grant similar in scope and sequence to the STR for \$75K and encourages access to these dollars. Joel reiterated the focus areas of the STR. Su Min corrected the name Project RED to say, "RED Project." Questions about initiative requests about this STR grant can be directed to Su Min.

Adolescent Treatment Grant Award – Will not start until October 2017. In the process of hiring a departmental specialist for this position.

Emerging Issues and Trends - *All*

Opioids, Prescription Drugs, Alcohol, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - *Su Min Oh/Group*

- **Opioids and Prescription Drugs – Opioids** - House Bills 4403 to 4408 have passed and an explanation of each bill were described and explained. To view the bills, you may visit the website by clicking on this link <http://www.legislature.mi.gov> Still working on converting prescription data by county level for MAPS for their yearly drug utilization report. The 2016 death data is also being collected.
- **Legalizing Marijuana** – Attended the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) conference where marijuana surveillance was a topic.
- **E-cigarettes** – Senate bill 37 introduced in February prohibiting minors; however, is still not considered a tobacco product; a huge concern. This month house bill 4736 seeks to increase the minimum age of purchase from 18 to 21; some counties are already involved.

- **Alcohol** – Pat tells everyone about disposing the ½ mile rule in June, but failed. He also mentioned the CDC Alcohol Density shows a higher density rate for violent crime; the higher the density, the higher the crime rate. He suggests this for Grand Rapids to outlet density. All data is on LARA website and public.

Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP) – Dianne Perukel - Tabled

Syringe Service Programs - Joe Coyle

Joe attended the CSTE conference where there was a roundtable which he spoke on about Michigan’s epidemics. Discussion surrounded people needed in crosscutting positions where current epidemics are prevalent. An article was shared at the conference by Su Min on the societal costs of heroin abuse. The FDA recently recommended to remove Opana ER from the market, which is a formulation of Oxycodone due to the public health consequences of its use and abuse.

Data Driven Prevention Initiative for Prescription Drug Overdose – Tom Largo

The Data Driven Prevention Initiative for the Prescription Drug Overdose (PDO) grant was awarded. Will be adding \$15,000 along with Su Min’s group (OROSC) which will allow more questions to be asked.

The Michigan surveillance system to improve morbidity and mortality on opioid overdose poisonings grant that was not funded; however, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) was finally approved and funded for \$350,000 per year with a focus on medical examiners and opioid overdose, syndromic surveillance, and emergency EMS system. A conference call discussion will be taking place with Sara and the CDC.

Practical Tool Development on Opioids – Joel Hoepfner

- Joel briefly explained what has been shared regarding the dashboard, and practical tool development indicators in the packet.
- Su Min relates to the group about the opioid epidemic as it relates to data available and/or needed.
- Nick describes the various items about statewide statistics on the Central Data Repository (CDR) mock-up in everyone’s possession. Joel suggests adding opioid surveillance/data dashboard under related items. Nick asked for suggestions on formatting. Joel requests promoting throughout the Prepaid Inpatient Health Plans (PIHP) and suggests alerting them to its arrival. Su Min will send mock-up to PIHP and Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Directors. The plan is to have it up and running before the next SEOW meeting (7/19/17). Liz is accepting recommendations, of which she is asking members to please send to Su Min at ohs@michigan.gov.
- Nick describes data visualization items that will be published on the CDR website and how they will be organized, as well as updated data, new tabs, among others.
