#### **OROSC Updates – Larry Scott**

- **State Opioid Response Grant Application** – Currently working on this grant. Current data is sufficient. New data not necessary.
- **Older Adult Wellness Initiative** – A technical assistance (TA) session from SAMHSA was conducted yesterday, July 17, 2018 in which several stakeholders were present, which included PIHPS, Office of Aging, MSU Extension and other providers, as well as the Minority Health Director. Discussion centered around health issues for older adults and the programming related to the opioid crisis because it

disproportionately impacts this group. Need more EPI data, including prevalence data among various substances. Need to learn how they are accessing these drugs, etc. We also need to define “Older Adult.” 55 and older is the federal standard. Please share your ideas on building a data warehouse surrounding this issue. Some ideas were offered. Joel suggests adding to a future agenda for a brainstorming session.

- **Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP) – Dianne Perukel**  
Dianne reiterated her previous discussion from the last meeting.
- **Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Communicable Disease/HAI, Infectious Diseases Update - Joe Coyle**  
**Governor Snyder’s Opioid Commission** - Information was shared with the group about Dr. Wells, who presented at Governor Snyder’s Opioid Commission regarding the infectious diseases related to the opioid epidemic. Unanimous support was received to expand Syringe Service Programs by the group. A letter will be going out to the Michigan Association Public Health Commission with recommendations from the commission to local public health. Related progress with streams of funding to the support programs. Also mentioned harm reduction items; conference, website, among others. Joel suggested a checklist template for guiding through the process. Further discussion took place along with questions and answers.
- **Bureau of Health and Wellness/Division of Chronic Disease and Injury Control/ Tobacco Section/Injury and Violence Prevention Unit/ – Su Min Oh for Chelsea Walker**
  - **Data Driven Prevention Initiative for Prescription Drug Overdose – Tabled**
  - **BRFSS**  
The Tobacco Section and the Prevention and Treatment Section have undertaken a joint initiative/venture to submit five drug related questions to the BRFSS for a 2019 Survey and results will be available in two years.
- **Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Environmental Health/Environmental Surveillance Section – Ashley Miller/Gabrielle Stroh Steiner/Sarah Rockhill**
  - **Michigan Opioid Morbidity and Mortality Surveillance**  
Ashley explains that they are working on the same grant that Joe is working on. Their segment focus is on bio surveillance, looking at syndromic, and emergency department data, as well as an EMS component. Due at the end of the month. Submitted second submission to CDC quarter two syndromic data. Also completing the first draft of dissemination piece to have to the group by the end of August.

- **Data Sources**

Sarah is creating a document of data sources and plans to complete by August 13, 2018. She also explained some of the various aspects of the document. Will share draft with the group. Su Min suggests adding to the September agenda.

- **2016 Drug Poisoning Deaths infographic #2**

Su Min tells everyone that the 2016 Drug Overdose Deaths in Michigan Factsheet #1 is in the Communications office awaiting approval. She also explained some of the changes in the graph. She explains the document and the related statistics/data for the 2016 Drug Poisoning Deaths infographic #2 which focuses on opioids. Will add suggestion of older adults.
