OROSC Updates – Su Min Oh

State Targeted Response (STR) to the Opioid Crisis Grant – All PIHPs received their award letters for fiscal year 2017/2018. Brittany added that more training will be taking place during all of August/September, all activities have been distributed to all the PIHPs, among other information. More opioid data is forthcoming from the Center for Disease Control (CDC).

Adolescent Treatment Grant Award – New departmental specialist starting July 31.

Emerging Issues and Trends - All

Opioids, Prescription Drugs, Alcohol, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - Su Min Oh/Group

- **Opioids and Prescription Drugs – Opioids** – Su Min reported that no legislative information. Press release on 2016 overdose deaths is available on OROSC website at www.michigan.gov/bhrecovery, as well as related data. A new website has been launched and can be accessed at www.michigan.gov/stopoverdoses. Met with the opioid data group and a decision was made as to what data will be shared with the public called. Also, the data is in the form of an infographic in their handouts and Su Min explained the data and indicated it will be on the CDR. Sent an e-mail to all SEOW members from Joe Coyle on two articles from the CDC.
- **Legalizing Marijuana** – No new information. Mention of penalties increased in the state, sampling and tasting for 21-year olds, church and school rules,
- **E-cigarettes** – No new information.
- **Alcohol** – No new information.

Partner Updates – All

Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP) – Dianne Perukel

Dianne explained that law enforcement launched a PBT and the related details. The minor in possession (MIP) is changing to a civil infraction in January 2018 and other details as far as driving records are related. More discussion about this subject continued.

Suggestion to add two new members that Dianne feels would add value to the SEOW group based on their position descriptions was described (Narcotics Intel Analyst); Sarah Wilson, Narcotics Manager, and Lisa G Cram, who oversees multijurisdictional task teams. Dianne also let everyone know how these two new members would support the group. Support from the SEOW was consensual.

Dianne talked about the drugged driving focus groups; two nights Grand Rapids and two nights in Southfield. She went on to describe the groups and their habits while driving, and other details.

Syringe Service Programs - Joe Coyle - Tabled

Information from someone about huge activity taking place on the east coast (MA, etc.), as well as in Florida, a 10-year old's death from Fentanyl.

Data Driven Prevention Initiative for Prescription Drug Overdose – Tom Largo

Su Min said a meeting with Jan Fields, the project evaluator for data driven prevention drug overdose did not take place due to having to submit a whole new workplan and evaluation to receive additional funding that is due soon. Chelsea Walker replaced Adrian Zeh.

Su Min said she will keep everyone informed on updates on infographics.

CDR Opioid Tab – Brooke Dudek and Nick Miller

Liz shared the Central Data Repository (CDR) tabs. Nick explained more work to take place on the CDR, specifically for the opioid epidemic and suggested various ways to depict the data, such as infographics, among others,

Young Adult Survey – Liz Agius

Liz talked about the Young Adult Survey and indicated that it was short; 19 questions. She also said report should be out late next week.
