Emerging Issues and Trends - All

Opioids and Prescription Drugs, Alcohol, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - Su Min Oh/Group

- **Alcohol** – The Half Mile Rule has been rescinded by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission (MLCC) and the legislature has proposed two bills that would make it law. Patrick is keeping a close eye on the developments and will keep us updated. There is belief that this issue may create a bigger problem with outlet density and will speak about it at next meeting.

Marijuana Task Force – The Michigan Prevention Association (MPA) has started organizing grassroots efforts throughout Michigan. A Meeting took place on September 18, 2017 with Tony Coder from Ohio who will be working with the grassroots people and teach them how to create messages and how to spread those messages. Michael Stroud has been hired to determine what topics will resonate with the public. Liz Lenz is coming up with messages until we hear from the polling. Scott Greenly has been hired for the lobbying piece, a phone call is being organized for October 31, 2017 at 3:45 pm, and language is being created for the Arabic Community. **Marijuana Resolution** - Stephanie talks about the marijuana resolution engaging the board of directors at region three and have also been asked to take a stand against the legalization of marijuana and are also asking Community Mental Health (CMH) and providers to sign-off on the non-legalization of marijuana. Will send resolution/ballot initiative to SEOW group. We are pushing non-legalization of marijuana across the state starting next year (2018). **Conference** - Dawn told everyone about a conference called *Keys to Addiction* that was held yesterday October 17, 2017. She also told everyone about an image result for HIDTAwww.dea.gov. The High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) program report is available and anyone that is interested in receiving it, let Dawn know. Joel suggests that John Chronic is also a good link for the report. **Video** –The *Chasing the Dragon* video has been revamped to 14 minutes and now it is appropriate for children and can only be shown in schools in Michigan. It is can be viewed on YouTube and is considered public and Dawn will e-mail to everyone.

Partner Updates – All

Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP) – Dianne Perukel

An Updated traffic crash fact sheet and MIP law that will go into effect January 2018 Diane will e-mail cheat sheet to all SEOW members, and the crash facts website has been updated.

Syringe Service Programs - Joe Coyle

There is a major Hepatitis (HEP) C epidemic underway related to the current heroin and opioid epidemic. He talks about the needle exchange program and how necessary it is for the prevention and transmission of diseases, such as HEP C, etc. Encouraging needle exchange expansion; current locations are Detroit, Grand Rapids, Ypsilanti, and Flint, and new sites in Lansing, Muskegon, and Petoskey. Katie Macomber is leads HIV prevention and will be piloting Central Health Department District #2, Marquette, and Chippewa. Syringe service workgroups will be starting again and Joe will keep everyone informed. Larry asks a question regarding Population Health conducting training sessions with PIHP Directors regarding HEP A. Joe lets everyone know about the HEP A outbreak and seeking ways to get information out to the various populations, i.e., homeless individuals, etc., about getting vaccinated against HEP A. Carolyn Castillo is leading the prevention work regarding HEP A and the website is www.Michigan.gov/hepatitisAoutbreak. Joe invites everyone to review the website and to submit their comments.

Data Driven Prevention Initiative for Prescription Drug Overdose – Chelsea Walker

November 6, 2017 is the next stakeholder meeting regarding the action plan strategies, as well as ideas they may have and where they stakeholders would like to assist. Chelsea says there will be seven contractors starting November 1, 2017; included are three pilot communities doing outreach and education to prescribers and data collection on opioid and prescription drug use and Marquette, Macomb and Catholic Human Services. She also explained work they are doing with Michigan OPEN/University of Michigan, Legislative and Regulatory Affairs (LARA), and Poison Control Center. Will share the action plan with the SEOW in the future. Larry requests that Dawn be kept in the loop about the PDO project and what she is doing regarding the Partnership for Success activity on the STR and recommends Sara Sircely from PIHP region two as a great resource.

State Epidemiological (EPI) Profile 2017 – Su Min Oh

The EPI Profile 2017 was e-mailed to everyone and Su Min explained portions, such as the indicators and other highlights of the report to the members. NarcsCare connected to MAPs was explained. Questions were asked and answers were offered. The timeframe for the final is in process. Please send your quick responses to Su Min as soon as possible.
