SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS

SEOW Meeting Introductions, Welcome, and Approval of Agenda/Minutes – *Joel Hoepfner*

- Joel welcomed members and members introduced themselves.
- October 19, 2016 Agenda was approved. Add practical tool development. Keep sending ideas and thoughts for agendas by forwarding to Joel, Su Min or Larry.
- The Minutes of October 19, 2016 were reviewed and approved by consensus.

Update on Next Steps/Action Items from Previous Meeting

- Dianne says information on drug called “Pink” is still in progress to be announced in future meeting.
- PFS 2015-2020, FY 2016 grant to be shared electronically.
- Policy Academy to be presented at next meeting in January.

OROSC Updates – *Larry Scott*

- **Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) National Child Welfare Grant** – Applied to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration National Child Welfare/Policy Academy. A MDHHS team consisting of OROSC, Child Welfare, Child Maternal Health, and Medicaid, to name a few to a planning session (10 states) to develop a statewide collaborative mechanism to reduce neonatal abstinence syndrome. This grant also spills over into decisions for Drug Courts and Child Protective Services among others.

Emerging Issues and Trends

Opioids, Prescription Drugs, Alcohol, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes - *Su Min Oh/Group*

- **Prescription Drugs** – None.
- **Alcohol** - No movement on any bills.
- **Heroin** – Information from Michigan counties regarding Carfentanil. Stephanie reports that over the weekend there was a Carfentanil death in Washtenaw County. There was another Carfentanil overdose; confirmation in process and will share with the group. Marie waiting on report from Cadillac about six overdoses, no deaths over the weekend. Joel says Carfentanil is more resistant to Naloxone and NARCAN. The Poison Control Center receives reports on overdoses and deaths through an alert system. More discussion on NARCAN and Naloxone, such as laws in the books. Larry mentions depending on Block Grant funding, how OROSC is looking at imbedding peer recovery support specialists in emergency rooms/departments to be involved with the patient; mimicking a project in New Jersey that is very successful.

- **Legalizing Marijuana** – No Michigan movement on any bills. More states have voted to legalize recreational marijuana and will share more about those states at the next meeting.
- **E-Cigarettes** – No movement on any e-cigarette bills.
- **Practical Tool Development**
Opioid use, abuse and what can be useful, provided variables are available for regions to produce. Liz mentions that due to the focus of the Feds, we need to gather more specific data, due to assuring that minorities, LGBTs health status disparities is accurately reflected/represented. She suggests training, TA on electronic health records, to include racial, ethnic and minorities for recruiting. Joel suggests other sources to gather information about disparities; such as health departments and hospital networks who are devoted to health disparities. Larry suggests contacting the EPI bureau because they have a lot of data they have collected.

Partner Updates – All

Michigan State Police (MSP) – Dianne informs everyone that she, along with others will be looking at the marijuana crash involved profiles. Will send out a couple samples. These samples are a test to find out what story is told by the data in the counties. Anyone else who is interested, please let Dianne know. Marie Helveston will review Alpena, Cadillac, Wexford, Grand Traverse, or Oscoda. Jerry will take any in the Upper Peninsula. Dianne asks the reviewers to look for math errors, among others.

Practical Tool Development – Joel Hoepfner

Joel states that Opioid poisonings and deaths sharing and needs assessments. Joel asks for other ideas. Liz mentions a document Achilles put together of county profiles and suggests the format for use because all the information is all in one spot. Joel would like trend data over time, such as a dashboard. Will create modules for plotting to see trends.

Central Data Repository (CDR) Updates – Liz Agius and Brooke Dudek

Brooke says St. Joseph and county profiles will be updated tonight (11/16/16). TEDs data is in repair. Liz encourages group to make sure the providers and coalitions are using the web CDR. A Listserv will be created and will be sent out to stakeholders and others as regular reminders to encourage regular use.

PRAMS Related to Substance Use – Pete Haak

Peter, the Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring System (PRAMS) coordinator, shared a PowerPoint about PRAMS describing the PRAMS program (see attached). There is a mandate to use our data and work with those that need the data. Send e-mails to Peter for questions/information.

PFS2015-2020 FY16 Summary – Kelli Martin

Kelli Martin describes the PFS 2015-2016 and distributed a summary to the group. Grant year 01 (2016) has ended. She continued to describe the program's past, present, and future, such as funding, awards, communities, data, counties SBIRT, training, program fidelity, workplans specific to year, linking to healthcare system, among others.
