SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS

Introductions, Welcome, and Approval of Agenda/Minutes – Joel Hoepfner

- Joel Hoepfner welcomed members and members introduced themselves.

Update on Next Steps/Action Items from Previous Meeting – Joel Hoepfner

- Review Draft *FY 2019 Michigan Epidemiological Profile (EPI)* – on today’s agenda
- Strategic Plans Review – will take place as they become available

OROSC Updates – Angie Smith Butterwick for Larry Scott

- **SOR/STR Funding** – Angie explained what is taking place regarding both *State Opioid Response (SOR)* and *State Targeted Response (STR)* funding, such as working with Dr. Khaldun’s office to assure that funds are being used. Carry Forward in process for the SOR reporting. No decision on STR funding continuation. Final fiscal reports being prepared in conjunction with the carry forward. Receiving media requests regarding the opioid grant(S).
- **NARCAN** - Distributed nearly 20,000 Narcan kits to pharmacies on our Distribution Day September 14, 2019. In addition, we redistributed 24,000 to various programs, such as syringe support programs, treatment providers, OTPs, homeless shelters, law enforcement agencies, among others. The next goal is we are working with the *Department of Corrections (DOC)* to make sure those released receive NARCAN.

The plan for January is to set-up a public portal for entities to request Narcan, which will be on the opioid website. The *Anti-Stigma Campaign* starts this week and materials will be on the opioid website. The second part of the campaign starts next week, and materials will be on the opioid website as well. Please share your thoughts on the campaign. Details at Michigan.gov/opioids. Lisa mentioned an *End the Stigma Campaign* on changing the script on how opioid use disorders is discussed. Questions were asked and answers shared.

Emerging Issues and Trends - *Su Min Oh/Patrick Hindman/Alia Lucas/Group*

Opioids and Prescription Drugs, Alcohol, Heroin, Marijuana, E-Cigarettes – *Su Min Oh/Group*

- **Prescription Drugs** – Su Min shared and described certain data findings on *Michigan Drug Overdose Mortality, 2018*. Specific data can be shared in the future. Waiting on the press release. Questions were asked and answers shared.
- **Heroin - Tabled**
- **Marijuana Use** – Lisa gave an update on what is taking place regarding marijuana, such as producing a marijuana prevention campaign to educate people 14-21 years of age of the legal, educational, health and social risks that come from using marijuana underage.

Two new commissioners have been appointed by Governor Whitmer to the *Liquor Control Commission*. A semi-annual public hearing is being held at Constitution Hall December 4, 2019.

Information was shared with the group on this subject, talking about suboxone and medication assisted treatment.

- **Bureau of Epidemiology and Population Health/Division of Communicable Disease/HAI, Infectious Diseases Update – *Joe Coyle/Seth Eckel//Brandon Hool***
 - **Syringe Service Program (SSP)** – Handout were discussed that included media campaigns, injection drug use related invasive infections, which can be found on our website at www.michigan.gov/ssp. Passed out the one pager which describes what was given out. Also talked about hospital data from the Michigan hospital database, patient stays 2016-2018 *International Classification of Diseases (ICD)* code proxy use withdrawal. Also communicated was the cost involved. **Next Steps:** Looking at more years and the cost to incorporate emergency department data, among others based on the availability of robust data if SSPs work in certain geographies, such as inpatient stays and dispositions. Also looking at partnering with a healthcare system. Looking to have a utilization program. Expect a release date of December 12, 2019. Larry encourages the group to work closely with the SSP providers. Questions and answers were shared.

Brooke explained to everyone the MI-SUDDR for the new people that do not know and updated everyone on the changes that have taken place. A to-do-list is needed. She further explained the various tabs. In addition she asked for suggestions on improvements. The website will be updated after the next census. Asked members their thoughts about the blogs. Joel suggests adding a utilization section. Other members offered suggestions were offered and questions were answered. A download area has been added.
