This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the intent by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) and Alternative Benefit Plan (ABP) amendment request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

The purpose of these amendments is to update the Medicaid State Plan and ABP to permit licensed dental therapists to become enrolled with Michigan Medicaid and be reimbursed for their services. MDHHS expects this change to have a positive impact on Native American beneficiaries by increasing access to dental services. The anticipated effective date of the SPA and ABP amendment is October 1, 2021.

There is no public hearing scheduled for the SPA and ABP amendment. Input regarding this request is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS liaison to the Michigan tribes.
