***Policy and Methods for Establishing Payment Rates
(Long Term Care Facilities)***

N. Payment Determination for State Veterans Homes

The payment rates to State Veterans Homes shall be prospective, per patient day, and based on patient acuity groupings. The rates for these facilities shall not be subject to the provisions in sections IV.A. through IV.M. above, but instead the following provisions shall be used for payment determination:

1. The single state agency shall utilize ~~Resource Utilization Groups (RUGS)~~ THE PATIENT DRIVEN PAYMENT MODEL (PDPM) to set payment rates. The Minimum Data Set (MDS) shall be employed to calculate a RUG PDPM score which will be used to determine a patient's acuity.
2. The payment rates associated with ~~an individual RUG PDPM category~~ CATEGORIES shall be set as a percentage of what the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services would pay under the Medicare Skilled Nursing Facility Prospective Payment System (SNF PPS). The percentage shall not exceed 100% of the Medicare rate.
 - a. Payment = (percentage * Medicare SNF PPS ~~RUG PDPM~~ rate) * billed XIX days.
3. The patient's RUG PDPM score shall be reported on any claim submitted to the single state agency and based on the applicable MDS assessment(s) to the billing period.
4. Participating providers shall not receive any supplemental payments from the single state agency.
5. Allowable cost identification for cost reporting and upper payment limit purposes will not follow section III of this attachment, but will follow the Medicare principles of reimbursement in 42 CFR, Chapter IV, Subchapter B, Part 413 and the PRM-15.
6. FOR DATES OF SERVICE BETWEEN OCTOBER 1, 2019 AND DECEMBER 31, 2019, STATE VETERANS HOMES MAY CONTINUE TO BE REIMBURSED UNDER THE RESOURCE UTILIZATION GROUP-IV (RUG-IV) FOR MEDICAID RESIDENTS WITH AN MDS ASSESSMENT WITH AN ASSESSMENT REFERENCE DATE (ARD) PRIOR TO OCTOBER 1, 2019. RUG-IV RATES DURING THIS PERIOD WILL BE SET AS A PERCENTAGE OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2019 MEDICARE SNF PPS RUG-IV RATES. REIMBURSEMENT WILL BE SET USING PDPM FOR RESIDENTS WITH AN ARD ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2019, AND REIMBURSEMENT WILL BE BASED SOLELY ON PDPM FOR DATES OF SERVICE ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2020.

RE: State Veterans' Home Reimbursement Methodology Change

This letter, in compliance with Section 1902(a)(73) and Section 2107(e)(1)(C) of the Social Security Act, serves as notice of intent to all Tribal Chairs and Health Directors of the request by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA).

The purpose of the SPA is to update the reimbursement methodology for State Veterans' Homes based on the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) changes to the Skilled Nursing Facility Prospective Payment System methodology. MDHHS expects this change to have little or no impact on Native American beneficiaries, tribal health clinics and urban Indian organizations. The anticipated effective date of this SPA is October 1, 2019.

There is no public hearing scheduled for this SPA. Input regarding this SPA is highly encouraged, and comments regarding this notice of intent may be submitted to Lorna Elliott-Egan, MDHHS liaison to the Michigan tribes. Lorna can be reached at 517-284-4034, or via email at Elliott-EganL@michigan.gov. **Please provide all input by June 4, 2019.**

In addition, MDHHS is offering to set up group or individual consultation meetings to discuss this SPA according to the tribes' preference. Consultation meetings allow tribes the opportunity to address any concerns and voice any suggestions, revisions, or objections to be relayed to the author of the proposal. The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) plans to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to make various updates to the Medicaid nursing facility cost reporting audit and reimbursement processes.

The anticipated effective date for the Nursing Facility Cost Reporting Audit & Reimbursement Revisions SPA is October 1, 2019.

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) is revising various nursing facility cost reporting audit and reimbursement policies, to comply with the requirements of Michigan Public Act (PA) 612 of 2018, to make processes more efficient and effective in order to meet the new requirements, and to update certain outdated policies.

The major requirements of Michigan PA 612 of 2018 include:
• A nursing facility cost report must be accepted within 60 calendar days of the filing of the cost report;
• An audit of an accepted cost report must be completed within 21 months;
• An on-site audit cannot last longer than 30 calendar days
• Annual report year for an individual nursing facility and no longer than 180 calendar days for more than six months of the year or controlled nursing facility (if the provider and MDHHS agree, then the on-site days limit may be waived); and
• Final settlement of an audited cost report must be delivered to the provider within 60 calendar days of the issuance of the Final Summary of Audit Adjustments Notice.

This State Plan Amendment is budget neutral.

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) plans to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) request to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to update the reimbursement methodology for State Veterans' Homes based on the CMS' changes to the Skilled Nursing Facility Prospective Payment System methodology.

The anticipated effective date for the State Veterans' Home Reimbursement Methodology Change SPA is October 1, 2019.

Pending approval from CMS, the Michigan Medicaid State Plan will be modified to allow for policy changes to the State Veterans' Home reimbursement methodology from the Resource Utilization Group (RUG) IV system to the Patient Driven Payment Model (PDDM) system and updates the billing requirements to reflect this change. CMS will change their reimbursement system from the RUG IV to the PDDM effective October 1, 2019. Therefore, this policy change is necessary since the Veterans' Home rates are tied to the Medicare rates. CMS will also discontinue RUG for all states effective October 1, 2020.
