

SCHOOL WELLNESS PROGRAM SAFEGUARDS: CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT REPORTING

THIS DOCUMENT IS TO BE USED AS A GUIDANCE TOOL IN DEVELOPING CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT REPORTING SAFEGUARDS FOR SCHOOL WELLNESS PROGRAMS.

Safeguards:

- 1. Follow state law for reporting child abuse/neglect*.
- 2. Nurses and social workers are legally mandated to report suspected child abuse/neglect including human and labored trafficked youth.
- 3. Understand that it is not the health provider's responsibility to conduct the investigation to determine whether abuse exists.
- 4. Ensure the SWP policies/procedures are in accordance with state law and reflect clearly defined roles and responsibilities related to the recognition and reporting of suspected abuse and neglect.
 - a. Follow fiduciary guidelines for reporting abuse/neglect including release of information if available.
 - b. Identify safety concerns.
 - c. Maintain confidentiality.
 - d. Document significant subjective and objective findings.
 - e. File a report to CPS using the appropriate method (online or via phone call).
- 5. Ensure policies and procedures protect providers from HIPAA violations regarding notification of the school administration regarding a CPS report.
- 6. Document any questions asked and answers given, as well as the sources for information.
- Explain to the student/client that information will not be discussed with students or others but must be reported if there is anything that could bring harm to them or others.

- 8. Work to establish/improve collaboration and a trustful relationship with Children's Protective Services to establish "best practices" for communication and other necessary interactions.
- 9. Ensure that any screening for child sexual abuse is completed by an individual/team that has appropriate training and credentials (local Child Advocacy Center, etc.).
