

PFAS Response and Emerging Public Health Threat Activities

(FY2020 Appropriation Act - Public Act 67 of 2019)

February 1, 2020

Sec. 1231. (1) *From the funds appropriated for local health services, up to \$4,750,000.00 shall be allocated for grants to local public health departments to support Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) response and emerging public health threat activities. A portion of the funding shall be allocated by the department in a collaborative fashion with local public health departments in jurisdictions experiencing PFAS contamination. The remainder of the funding shall be allocated to address infectious and vector-borne disease threats, and other environmental contamination issues such as vapor intrusion, drinking water contamination, and lead exposure. The funding shall be allocated to address issues including, but not limited to, staffing, planning and response, and creation and dissemination of materials related to PFAS contamination issues and other emerging public health issues and threats.*

(2) *By February 1 of the current fiscal year, the department shall provide a report to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on the department budget, the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the state budget office on actual expenditures in the previous fiscal year and planned spending in the current fiscal year of the funds described in subsection (1), including recipient entities, amount of allocation, general category of allocation, and detailed uses.*



The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) had actual expenditures in the amount \$2,815,486.87 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 as identified in Appendix A. For FY20 the MDHHS is providing current anticipated expenditures totaling \$1,792,988.99 which can be found in Appendix B. We will continue to monitor other emerging health threats and allocate additional funds as needed throughout the remainder of the Fiscal Year.
