Dear Senator MacGregor and Representative Poleski:

This report is provided pursuant to the Department of Human Services' (DHS') Fiscal Year 2015 Appropriations Act, PA 252 of 2014, Article X, Section 513(3). This section requires that the department submit a report on the number of Michigan children residing in out-of-state facilities at the time of this report; the total cost and average per diem cost of the out-of-state placements to this state; and a list of each such placement arranged by the Michigan county of residence for each child.

The first page of the report provides the number of Michigan children placed in out-of-state facilities at the time of this report and the approximate total cost and average per diem cost of these out-of-state placements. These numbers are broken down by court-supervised children and Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS)-supervised children. The remaining pages of the report list all current MDHHS-supervised out-of-state facility placements and all current court-supervised placements arranged by the Michigan county of residence for each child.

The total cost reported reflects the amount paid to all out-of-state facilities. Court placements are funded by the County Child Care Fund (CCCF). The county pays 100 percent of the cost to the facility, then bills the state for 50 percent of the eligible costs. However, a portion of some of the payments for court placements, as well as MDHHS placements, may be covered by court-ordered parental support money, government benefits or some other type of collection. Therefore, it is not possible to provide the exact dollar amount that the state reimburses the county for these placement settings. An approximate state cost is provided in the report.
