### **FIP, PATH Employment Activities**

(FY2017 Appropriation Bill - Public Act 268 of 2016)

### January 20, 2017

- **Sec. 677.** (1) The department shall establish a state goal for the percentage of family independence program cases involved in employment activities. The percentage established shall not be less than 50%. The goal for long-term employment shall be 15% of cases for 6 months or more.
- (2) On a quarterly basis, the department shall report to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on the department budget, the senate and house fiscal agencies and policy offices, and the state budget director on the number of cases referred to Partnership. Accountability. Training. Hope. (PATH), the current percentage of family independence program cases involved in PATH employment activities, an estimate of the current percentage of family independence program cases that meet federal work participation requirements on the whole, and an estimate of the current percentage of the family independence program cases that meet federal work participation requirements for those cases referred to PATH.

## 2. Current percentage of FIP cases involved in PATH employment activities:

The percentage of Family Independence Program (FIP) cases "involved in PATH employment activities for October 2016 was <u>68.5%</u>. The percentage of Family Independence Program (FIP) cases "involved in PATH employment activities for November 2016 was <u>69.1%</u>. The table below provides a breakdown of participants coded as "Work First" and includes all FIP recipients (federal and state-funded) who attended orientation and started an activity.

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# 3. Current percentage of FIP cases that meet federal work participation requirement.

The federal work participation rate is based on a monthly review of a statistically valid sample of federally-funded active FIP recipients who have been referred to PATH and have completed the required FIP 21-day orientation. Reviews are completed by the MDHHS Office of Quality Assurance and Internal Control and the work participation rate is calculated per federal regulations. The current percentage of federally-funded FIP cases (meeting the above qualifications) that meet federal work participation requirements broken down by month for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of Fiscal Year 2016 is:

July 2016 70.24% August 2016 58.31% September 2016 65.42%

The year-to-date work participation rate through the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of Fiscal Year 2016 (October 2015 – September 2016) is <u>65.20%</u> as of December 13, 2016. The FIP work participation rates are point-in-time rates subject to change based on receipt of verifications and review by the federal Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families.

The MDHHS Office of Quality Assurance and Internal Control reports Work Participation Rate (WPR) on a three-month lag because of the rigorous methodology and testing required to calculate the data.

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4. Current percentage of the FIP cases that meet federal work participation requirements for those referred to PATH.

Of the reviewed population of clients who were PATH participants supervised by the Michigan Works! Agencies, the percentage of clients who met the federal work requirements broken down by month for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of Fiscal Year 2016 is:

July 2016 77.32% August 2016 70.44% September 2016 71.85%

The year-to-date work participation rate for PATH participants supervised by the Michigan Works! Agencies through the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of Fiscal Year 2016 (October 2015 – September 2016) is **71.77%** as of December 13, 2016.
