DoyleR3@Michigan.gov Form #2660 will be required if federal funds are participating in any phase of a project involving engineering or project management related consultant services. It is to be completed by the person in Responsible Charge of the project, as identified in the Program Application, and submitted to MDOT Local Agency Programs with the initial submission of the Program Application. Form #2660 can be found in the MDOT Form Repository at: https://mdotjboss.state.mi.us/webforms/GetDocument.htm?fileName=2660.pdf Use of the guidelines and Form #2660 will be required for all Grade Inspection (GI) Packages submitted on or after October 1, 2020, for projects that propose using federal funds for professional services. Voluntary use prior to October 1, 2020 is encouraged. MDOT Local Agency Programs has worked closely with the FHWA Michigan Division office during the development of these documents.
