

New Transportation Center in Pontiac is Open.

The Pontiac Transportation Center is an intermodal station serving Amtrak , intercity buses from Greyhound Lines and local buses from the Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation. Construction of the facility began on July 16, 2010, and it opened on August 8, 2011, with the opening ceremony attended by US representative Gary Peters, state representative Tim Melton and representatives of the Michigan Department of Transportation, Amtrak, Pontiac and Greyhound.



The facility had a total cost of \$1.4 million and was funded via Michigan's Comprehensive Transportation Fund. It measures about 4,500 square feet in size, and includes a passenger lobby with bus ticketing facilities, restrooms, Amtrak crew base and covered waiting areas for both trains and buses. It is served by three daily train departures, between two and eight daily Greyhound departures and local bus service.
