What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and Blue Water Bridge Canada (BWBC), co-owners of the Blue Water Bridge, will be resurfacing and waterproofing the westbound span of the bridge.

When Will This Be Done?

Work is scheduled to begin in late March and is expected to be completed by the end of July.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

The westbound span will be closed for the duration of the project while traffic is maintained in both directions on the eastbound span.

Westbound traffic (entering the United States)

■ After passing through the Canadian toll booths, westbound traffic will be directed to the eastbound span of the bridge and travel in the right lane.

■ At the midpoint of the bridge, westbound traffic will split into two lanes:

- Commercial traffic will be directed to the center lane.
- Passenger traffic will remain in the right lane.

■ As traffic approaches the U.S. plaza, traffic will merge into separate lanes to the right. Vehicles will be separated by type, with changeable message signs above each booth alerting motorists to the appropriate lanes to use to proceed through customs.

■ During FAST operational hours, all FAST trucks should stay to the far left lanes (at least one lane will be set up for FAST). Other commercial traffic should stay to the right for the appropriate lane.

■ All passenger vehicles without trailers, RVs, and non-Nexus should proceed to the lane furthest to the right and use Lane 13, unless traffic is backed up and other lanes are available.

Eastbound traffic (entering Canada)

■ After passing through the Michigan toll booths, eastbound traffic will be directed to the right lane of the eastbound span of the bridge.

■ At the midpoint of the bridge, eastbound traffic will split into two lanes:

- Passenger traffic will be directed to the center lane.
- Commercial traffic will remain in the right lane.

■ As traffic approaches the Canadian plaza, vehicles will be separated by type, with changeable message signs above each booth alerting motorists to the appropriate lanes to use to proceed through customs.

Long-term Benefits

This work will preserve the safety and reliability of the Blue Water Bridge.
