What Is Being Done?

M-104 (Cleveland Street) will be reconstructed and widened from west of 124th Avenue east to I-96 in Crockery Township, Ottawa County.

This project is being done in coordination with the reconstruction of the I-96/112th Avenue interchange, less than a mile to the east. Motorists are advised that lane and ramp closures associated with this project will be in place during the M-104 project, including the closure of the 112th Avenue bridge over I-96 until late October.

When Will This Be Done?

Work will begin in July and is scheduled to continue until November.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

Traffic will be maintained during construction on M-104 at all times. For a majority of the work, one lane will be open in each direction. However, during several stages it will be necessary to allow only one lane of traffic to be open at a time under flag control.

Long-term Benefits

This project will ensure long-term use and increase the ride quality. The addition of the center left-turn lane on M-104 will improve safety and the flow of traffic.
