- Q1: On Page 13 the RFP it discusses the Equipment Plan and the Make and Model of the proposed vehicles, do the vehicles need to be new or no older than a certain model year?
- A1: No
- Q2: Is there a base GVWR associated with the vehicles that is required or any other minimum specifications?
- A2: Page 15 states, "The Consultant shall provide the necessary base(s) from which the FCP program will park the FCP vehicles when not in use."
- Q3: Given the patrol routes and miles listed on page 3 needed to be patrolled, is there a minimum amount of the vehicles that need to be procured?
- A3: No
- Q4: Is it SEMTOC goal to have the vehicles constantly in motion and patrolling or staged in key areas?
- A4: They should be patrolling.
- Q5: Incident response time is reported by shift in the performance reports on the website. Is data on the (FCP) Incidents that occurred available per shift?
- A5: We are compiling historical data and will post by Monday, April 11. The compiled FCP data will include number of incident, % dispatched, and average response times per shift for the six (6) most recent months.
- Q6: To best determine the optimal staffing plan associated with the program, can the state share historical staffing by shift in order to compare to the response time metrics? For example, is there data on the number of units on duty by shift by day for that last 12 months?
- A6: Baseline coverage over the past twelve (12) months is listed below, and actual coverage may vary:  
1<sup>st</sup> Shift (10PM-6AM) 2 units  
2<sup>nd</sup> Shift (6AM-2PM) 7 units  
3<sup>rd</sup> Shift (2PM-10PM) 7 units  
Weekends (all 6 shifts) 2 units

Q7: Is there a living wage requirement associated with the patrol operators which respondents need to be aware of?
