Q: In Section 1.10.2 of the MDOT Selection Guidelines for Service Contracts (https://www.michigan.gov/documents/MDOT_Consultant-Vendor_Selection_Guidelines-0106_145222_7.pdf) it says: "In all cases, the prime consultant must perform at least 40% of the services, by dollar value, unless otherwise specified in the RFP. In all cases, tier one subconsultant(s) must perform at least 50% of the services, by dollar value of their subcontract, unless otherwise specified in the RFP."

Do these 40% and 50% rules apply to only the services part of our proposal, or do they apply to both the goods and services?

A: These rules apply to both goods and services.

Q: If a vendor only supplies goods and/or custom engineer products, are they considered a subconsultant?

A: This is dependent upon the relationship and the services proposed. A Subconsultant is defined as any person, company, etc., where people are engaged in an activity, performing any service for which MDOT has contracted with a prime consultant. A Supplier is defined as any person, company, etc., that supplies material and/or a commodity/product without an associated service.
