What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is constructing a modern roundabout at the intersection of US-41/M-28 and Second Street in Ishpeming and resurfacing US-41/M-28 from Third Street to Malton Road. In addition to this project, the City of Ishpeming will also be constructing a roundabout connecting Second and Third streets, closing Third Street with a cul-de-sac at US-41/M-28, and reconstructing Third Street from Park Street to the connector roundabout.

When Will This Be Done?

The project is scheduled to begin in April and be completed in October.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

The project will require lane closures at the intersection and traffic shifts. Through-traffic and access to local business and residences will be maintained during construction. The project will require alternating closures on Second and Third streets, with posted local detour routes. The work zone will generally remain open for pedestrian traffic. Slight delays are expected, with longer delays anticipated during peak traffic periods. Some nighttime paving work will be performed.

Long-term Benefits

The project will improve safety at this intersection, reduce motorist delay, improve ride quality and extend the pavement life by 20 years.
