

INFORMATION FOR PLANS

THIS INFORMATION MUST BE ON THE TITLE SHEET

Project Numbers - Provided by MDOT after programming

The title sheet must have a location map showing where the project is located and designating a detour route if applicable.

Local Plan Approval Signature Block - Plans must be signed by the local official responsible for the project.

Engineer Signature and Seal - Plans must be signed and sealed by the "licensed engineer" responsible for their preparation.

MDOT Spec Note -

The work covered by these plans shall be done in accordance with Michigan Department of Transportation 2003 Standard Specifications for Construction, as amended by Supplemental Specifications or Special Provisions.

Or-

Except where otherwise indicated on the plans or in the proposal and supplemental specifications or special provisions contained herein, all materials and workmanship shall be in accordance with the Michigan Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Construction, 2003 Edition,

Or-

similar language incorporating MDOT specs as the "bottom line" construction specifications.

AASHTO Note -

Improvements covered by these plans are in accordance with current AASHTO Guidelines. (include specific guideline and year if applicable),

Or-

similar language establishing a federally accepted standard under which the design was completed.

MISS DIG note - Call Miss Dig, 1-800-482-7171 three working days, excluding Saturday, Sunday and holidays, before starting your project.

List utility companies within the project area along with a contact person and phone number.

Utilities within the project limits should be shown on the plans.

Standard Plans - MDOT Standard Plans that are applicable to the project should be listed on the title sheet.

OTHER PLAN SHEETS:

The purpose of the plans and proposal is to tell the contractor "what work is to be done, how much work is to be done, where the work is to be done, and how the contractor is to be paid for the work." The easier it is for the contractor to determine this, the lower his bid price will be! Pay items and any work which is "included" must be clearly defined.

Right-of-way limits, including grading permits, should be shown on each plan sheet. Property limits and the owner should be shown where any work is outside the right of way.

Typical Cross Section, Detail, and/or Note Sheets - Normally there should be separate sheet(s) showing the proposed cross section and details, and if appropriate, the relationship to the existing cross section or conditions. This should include limits of removal, new material, pay limits, minimum clearances, etc. This is the place for special details and general notes for the project.

Quantity Sheet - A sub-total of all participating quantities, non-participating quantities, and a total of ALL quantities should be shown.
