DIRECTIVE EXTENDING CLOSURE OF MILLIONAIRE PARTIES

On March 10, 2020, Governor Whitmer issued Executive Order 2020-4. The order declared a state of emergency across the State of Michigan under section 1 of article 5 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963, the Emergency Management Act, 1976 PA 390, as amended, MCL 30.401-30.421, and the Emergency Powers of the Governor Act of 1945, 1945 PA 302, as amended, MCL 10.31-10.33. This state of emergency has been extended by subsequent Executive Orders including most recently Executive Order 2020-99.

On March 16, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-09, whereby places of public accommodations and public amusement were ordered closed to ingress, egress, use, and occupancy by members of the public. The order specifically included millionaire parties. On March 22, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-20 extending the closure of millionaire parties until April 13, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. and rescinded Executive Order 2020-09. On April 13, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-43 extending the closure of millionaire parties until April 30, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. and rescinded Executive Order 2020-20. On April 30, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-69 extending closure of millionaire parties until May 28, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. and rescinded Executive Order 2020-43. On May 22, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-100 extending the closure of millionaire parties until June 12, 2020 at 11:59 p.m.

It is, therefore, necessary to extend the closure of all millionaire parties until further notice. Millionaire party licensees may make a written request for a refund.
