**ORDER RESCINDING THE SUMMARY SUSPENSIONS
OF CASINO LICENSES**

**ORDER IMPLEMENTING EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-20
EXTENDING SHUTDOWN THROUGH APRIL 13, 2020**

Respondents, Greektown Casino, L.L.C., Detroit Entertainment, L.L.C., and MGM Grand Detroit, L.L.C. are casino licensees operating under the authority of the Michigan Gaming Control and Revenue Act (the Act), MCL 432.201- 432.226.

On March 10, 2020, Governor Whitmer issued Executive Order 2020-4. The order declared a state of emergency across the State of Michigan under section 1 of article 5 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963, the Emergency Management Act, 1976 PA 390, as amended, MCL 30.401-30.421, and the Emergency Powers of the Governor Act of 1945, 1945 PA 302, as amended, MCL 10.31-10.33.

On March 15, 2020, an Executive Order was issued summarily suspending casino operations on March 16, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.

On March 16, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-09 which closed places of public accommodations to ingress, egress, use, and occupancy by members of the public through March 30, 2020. The order included casinos.

On March 22, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-20 which extended the closure until April 13, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. and rescinded Executive Order 2020-09.

Under the Governor's authority to protect life and property and to bring the emergency situation within the affected area under control, there is no longer a need to have the casino licenses summarily suspended. The casinos, however, must remain closed pursuant to Executive Order 2020-20.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Executive Director Order issued March 15, 2020 is rescinded.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to the Governor's Executive Order 2020-20, casinos are to remain closed until the April 13, 2020 at 11:59 p.m., or as otherwise ordered.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
